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PARISH COUNCIL (Meeting 26 January, 1979)

Council decided to place an order with Stowmarket Maintenance Welding for the construction of the village sign. The proposed sign will be made of metal and wood and the final article is expected to stand on Chestnut Green.

The rent of the proposed play area in the Chestnuts will be £3 per annum. Council decided to purchase some swings as the initial part of a programme to equip the site.

It was decided that the Newsletter would retain its new format because of the financial savings which will be achieved, enough for instance to purchase the swings for the play area.

It was noted that there was now a vacancy for a Community Emergency Adviser. If anyone is interested please let me know.

The Area Surveyor was requested to repair the village name sign at the Bildeston end of the village.

The problem of parked cars outside the Pettiward Hall reducing visibility for motorists was discussed and the Pettiward Hall Committee representative agreed to raise the matter at the next Committee meeting.

Extensive parking on the Blll5 next to Finborough Park rugby pitches was noted and it was agreed to ask the Rugby Club to take action to eliminate the hazard.

The Area Surveyor is to be asked to examine the possibility of extending the footway running between the School and Oak Close, to the Post Office so as to improve visibility for pedestrians crossing at this point.

A questionaire on parish facilities was completed.
