PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Because of the General Election on 3rd May, the Parish Council Elections will now take place on Thursday, 24th May. The situation regarding nomination of candidates is still somewhat confused but I understand there may be a further period in which to put forward nominations. Please contact the Returning Officer if you have not already lodged your nomination but still wish to do so.

PARISH COUNCIL

Estimates are to be obtained for the construction of a car park for the Pettiward Hall. It will be about a quarter acre in size and will have a temporary vehicular access from Valley Lane.

A three-bay swing has been obtained for the proposed children's play area at the Chestnuts. Consideration is to be given to the construction of further equipment using volunteers from the young of the village.

Parking outside the Pettiward Hall front entrance is to be detered by the Pettiward Hall Committee so as to remove impediments to visibility at the Bll15-Valley Lane junction.

Two planning applications to develop Finborough Hall were considered. The first concerning conversion into 28 residential units (houses and flats) seemed to be impractical in view of the price of the Hall and the necessary conversion. The second application proposed an hotel and leisure centre with a large number of chalets to be erected near the existing EEB training school and for this application there did not appear to be sufficient detail about the use of the main Hall for the Council to form an opinion.
