REVIEW OF RIGHTS OF WAY

The Parish Meeting held in the Pettiward Hall on Monday, 10th September was attended by 27 people. The Meeting resolved:

- a) City Lane and Cagmans Lane be re-instated as byways open to all forms of traffic.
- b) the footpath running between the Golf Course and Combs Lane be diverted alongside the river.
- c) the metalled roads on the Finborough Hall Estate become bridleways. These roads encircle the Hall and continue to Onehouse as the North Drive.
- d) the footpath running alongside the railings North of the Hall (on the Golf Course) be reinstated on the map.
- e) the footpath from Pear Tree House to the footbridge north east of Dairy Farm be reinstated on the map.
