NOTICE OF PARISH MEETING

A Parish Meeting will be held in the Pettiward Hall on Friday, 16th November, 1979 commencing at 7.30 pm.

Business: To consider whether major improvement work (described below) be carried out at the Pettiward Hall.

The major improvement work consists of the following:

- (a) new toilets and improvements to kitchen, estimated to cost £5,600 to £5,800, and,
- (b) a guarter-acre car park in Valley Lane, estimated to cost up to £6,000.

The maximum cost could therefore be up to £12,000.

The Pettiward Hall Committee has, at present, in the region of £2.000 for this work. Therefore, the greater part of the cost would be borne by the parish rates. A forty-year loan for £6,000 would cost the equivalent of a 2p rate.

The Pettiward Hall Committee and Parish Council are seeking your active support for this Meeting in order to show a conclusive YES or NO as to whether their plans should proceed. If you have strong views that your money should be spent in this or other ways, or, not at all please come along.

Nomination papers will be available from Rev.Wake at the Vicarage during the week 10th to 17th October.

The cost of each by-election falls on the parish and costs £15 for an uncontested election and between £150 and £200 if contested.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING (28 Sept.1979)

A further by-election will be held to fill the vacancy on the Council. Details are elsewhere in this issue. Council was notified of a prospective candidate.

The District Council will be recommending to the Boundary Commission that there be no alteration to the parish boundary.

The village sign should be complete by the end of November.

A quote of £4,200 for the construction of a quarter-acre car park was received. In addition, there would be charges in respect of the land and the construction of the entrance bringing the total cost to about £6,000.

The go-ahead for the Council to construct a children's play area next to the School playing field has been given by the District Council. An application has been made to the Prince's Trust in order to obtain funds for the purchase of materials for making play equipment. It is anticipated that the construction of the equipment will be undertaken by young parish volunteers.

ROYAL BRITISH LEGION

The Flower Show on September, 29th was even more of a success than last year and showed a net profit of £27; about 100 people of all ages came to look at the wide range of exhibits. The tankard for the best exhibit went to Mr.J.Kerry of Stowmarket; Mrs.Bland gained the most points.
