#### PARISH COUNCIL

Inspection of the Pettiward Hall roof had revealed that major repairs were required. The Council considered that these took priority over the proposed internal improvement work and asked the Hall Committee to instruct a builder to undertake the work soon. In the meantime, the Hall Committee could investigate the possibility of an alternative improvement scheme which appeared to be less costly than the scheme suggested at the Parish Meeting held in November, 1979.

A grant of £25 towards the cost of the Village Sign was received from the Women's Institute, the originators of the idea of having a Village Sign to commemorate the Silver Jubilee.

Council heard that a grant of £310 towards materials had been received from the Prince's Trust by Mrs Ravenscroft on behalf of a group of young volunteers who are to construct equipment for the play area.

Town Green has been recorded as ownerless in the Commons and Village Green Register.
