COMMUNITY EMERGENCY ADVISER

There is still a vacancy for the above post in Great Finborough. If you meet the following criteria please consider applying for the post:-

You must:

- 1. know Great Finborough well
- 2. be known and accepted by parishioners and the Parish Council
- 3. have lived in the area more than two years
- 4. have experience in organisation and management
- 5. be able to communicate.

The task of the Adviser is:

- 1. to identify resources in Great Finborough and complete a record of these
- to arrange a team to be nominated to deal with a major emergency
- 3. to report to the Parish Council any activity in the emergency field.

There are usually four exercises held in the locality each year to assist Advisers in dealing with emergency situations.

The Newsletter is published and distributed free of charge to all house within the parish by Great Finborough Parish Council
