PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Rev.H.Wake was re-elected Chairman and Mrs.B.Grimaldi re-elected as Vice-Chairman.

Mr.Brooks from the Mid Suffolk District Planning Department discussed at length the recent erant of planning permission for a Care and Attention Home for the Elderly on land south of the Chestnuts estate, and the latest situation concerning the application for a gypsy caravan site in Combs Lane.

The Council was told that the proposed Care and Attention Home was residential and within the scope of the Village Plan. If it were built there would still be sufficient remaining land to house another 200 or so in new domestic residential units.

The proposed Home's close proximity to the Chestnuts Estate was expected to bring social benefits to both existing residents and those in the Home; it was claimed that the volume of traffic through the Chestnuts would be less than that generated by domestic residential development on the site; and because of the land sloping away from the adjoining Chestnuts houses, the proposed hospital block would not be as obtrusive as envisaged by the Parish Council.

The Council again expressed its opposition to the gypsy caravan site in Combs Lane. Mr. Brooks described national and local policy on gipsies and their sites. He reported that the Water Authority had objected to the proposed septic tank.

Local newspapers have subsequently reported that the District Council has rejected the application. The applicant now has a right of appeal against the decision.

It was reported that the play area site at the Chestnuts had been waterlogged for a considerable time due to the wet weather.

The Council will in future pay for the Pettiward Hall building insurance thus relieving the Hall Committee of a rather heavy annual burden.

Council was told of a promise of a grant from the District Council towards the Hall improvements.

The Council intend to distribute crowns commemorating the forthcoming wedding of HRH The Prince of Wales to all children in the parish.

A protest was made about the new road markings at the junction of Valley Lane and Jacks Lane. They created a danger by giving priority to traffic emerging from Jacks Lane.
