Points from the Meeting (13th May)

Clearance of City Lane is to be carried out by the new Conservation Team based at Stowmarket.

Development at the unauthorised tip near Finborough Bridge was again reported to the County Councillor.

The District Council was seeking a quotation for two street lights to be placed in Oak Close.

The County Council, although having no objection to the erection of a safety barrier outside the front door of the Pettiward Hall, had no funds for such work. Details of cost and layout were requested by the Parish Council.

Mr. Cass resigned as Community Emergency Adviser. It was agreed to consider a new appointment at the next meeting.

Onehouse Parish Council had written suggesting that the two Parish Councils join forces to try and combat the general encroachment in the Rattlesden river valley. The Planning Officer has been invited to the next meeting to discuss the various issues in conjunction with Councillors from Onehouse.
