PARISH COUNCIL

Points from the Annual Meeting

Dr.B.Smith was re-elected Chairman and Mr.M.Lloyd elected as Vice-Chairman.

There was a long discussion concerning the play area at the Chestnuts Estate. Several residents of the Chestnuts gave their views on the problems which they encountered living near the site. PC Palmer from the Stowmarket police attended the meeting and gave assurances that action would be taken against any disruptive element provided residents contacted Stowmarket Police Station in time so that he could apprehend the offenders. As to the vandalised equipment, it was agreed to ask the Youth Club if it could organise some repairs such as fitting car tyres to the swing chains to form a seat.

PC Palmer also reported that speed checks on the 40 mph limit through the village carried out on three separate occasions revealed 7 in excess of the limit and two drivers were reported.

The police had made numerous visits to the Parish Church on the lookout for vandals but no further damage had been noted.

Council accepted the offer of the Youth Club to deliver the Newsletters in future. The Youth Club felt unable to carry out deliverics in the Combs Lane area and Trevor Waspe will continue as before.

Changes in legislation have meant a new process for alteration of the Definitive Map of Rights of Way (including footpaths and bridleways). The SALC has pointed out that claimaints seeking change are required to resubmit their claims even though evidence has already been submitted (in 1979) in the last review. When a new claim for change has been made the existing evidence on file will be brought forward for re-appraisal. More about this subject in next month's Newsletter.

It was agreed to share the cost of the entry fee to the Inter Village Sports Competition with Buxhall Parish Council.

The next meeting has been fixed for Friday, 20th July, 1984 at $7.30~\mathrm{pm}$ in the Pettiward Hall.
