PARISH COUNCIL

At its recent meeting the Parish Council estimated that it would need to raise £2,371 by way of parish rates in 1985/86. This would mean a rate of 4.9p in the £ compared with a figure of 4.7p in the last two years. Full consideration was given to keeping to the current year's level of spending as sought by the District Council which was attempting to avoid rate penalties for excess spending (the Parish Council's expenditure is included in the District Council's target set by the Government). However, taking into account the parish rate has been fairly steady over recent years and that the Council did not to want to interupt its programme of grants for improvement work at the Pettiward Hall it agreed to a small increase over the current year.

The District Council had resisted the suggestion to re-number properties along the High Road. It felt that the problems had arisen by poor addressing of mail. However, it did offer to provide a name-board for Bulls Cottages and this suggestion will be taken up with the residents.

REFUSE COLLECTION SERVICE

We have been advised by the District Council of the following arrangements for refuse collection over Christmas and the New Year. There will be no refuse collections on Monday 24th, Tuesday 25th, Wednesday 26th December nor Tuesday, 1st January.

The collection for Wednesday 26th December will take place on Thursday 3rd January. There will be a collection on Thursday, 27th December as normal. The collections for Wednesday and Thursday 2nd and 3rd January will take place one day later. Polythene sacks will be delivered to accomodate the extra refuse which would normally be collected on Wednesday, 26th.

GREAT FINBOROUGH UNITED CHARITY

What is the United Charity?

As described in the July Newsletter, the new Great Finborough United Charity was formed earlier this year by an amalgamation of the older charities in the parish. The income of the United Charity can be used as follows:

- (a) for the relief of persons resident in Great Finborough who are in conditions of need, hardship and distress either in fifts in kind or grants of money.
- (b) in promoting the education (including social and physical training) of persons under the age of 25 years who, or one of whose parents are, resident in Great Finborough, and, who are in need of financial assistance.

Who may apply?

Anyone coming within the terms shown above may apply for a grant. Alternatively, a relative, friend or neighbour may apply on behalf of someone else. Applications should be made to any of the trustees the names of whom are listed below.

When can grants be made?

Crants would cover instances where provision is not made by supplementary benefits or where other state entitlements are not available. Each application will be considered by the trsutees on its merits in the light of the funds available at the time. Funds currently total only a few hundred f's so the scope for significant assistance is restricted.

What type of rants are there?

Grants can be made in the following forms:

- (a) money eg. cash grant
- (b) fifts of consumables ef. fuel or loans of houshold items such as furniture.
- (c) provision of facilities eg. tuition fees or travelling expenses.

Of course the terms of the Charity cover those who are old, sick disabled handicapped and infirm. Special assistance may be appropriate in these circumstances.

Where are the funds to come from?

Althou, h this Charity is only a few months old it does take over from the long established charities which gave assistance to those in need in Creat Finborough for over 100 years. Currently income from investments is only £65 p.a. - exactly the same as for the former charities. Accordingly much reliance will continue to be made on donations and fund-raising which has been so £ enerous over recent years - please do carry on raising money for this Charity.
