PETTIWARD HALL

As indicated last month, the Management Committee has reviewed hire charges for the Hall and the revised rates effective from 1st January 1989 are as follows:

Main Hall Session	Hire by residents	Hire by non-residents
Morning	£5.00	£10.00
Afternoon	£5.00	£10.00
Evening	£10.00	£20.00

Disco/dance rate applicable to public functions is £40.00 (£10.00 less for organisations represented on the Management Committee).

The returnable-deposit for public functions and private hirings rises to £50.00.

Rates applicable to village organisations are assessed on the basis of ability to pay and are calculated on the appropriate general hiring rate, less the concession agreed by the Management Committee. Rates for hiring other items from the Hall e.g. trestle tables or cutlery, are available on request but please book their hire in advance with the Booking Secretary.

Talking of the Booking Secretary, Brenda Wyer, who has done sterling work since taking on the job, has increased personal commitments and as a result feels that she can no longer carry on as Booking Secretary. This is an important job for the Hall and involves keeping the diary, taking bookings and 'billing' regular hirers. It is unpaid financially, but does offer the opportunity for involvement in the life of our village. We are therefore looking for a volunteer to take over from Brenda when she hangs up her diary at the end of January. You don't have to be associated with the Hall at present or have been living in the village for a particular period - no qualifications necessary. Anyone interested, please let me know (Stow.676249)

FROM THE FILES

Extracts from Newsletter No.2 - January 1975

Comments were invited as to whether Great Finborough be grouped with Buxhall and have a common Parish Council.

The Buxhall Parish Council had written to the Area Surveyor requesting that parking on School Green be restricted so as not to obstruct the view of road users.

The Great Finborough Parish Council were to meet the Deputy Chief Technical Officer from the District Council to discuss the present position concerning the By-Products Factory smell problem.

A precept (parish rates) of 1.1p in the £ would be made for 1975/76 raising £478.

Complaints had been received about the use of the Primary School playing field by cyclists and dogs.

There was a proposal to set up a Parish Funds Trust, a sort of local bank and fund-raising body for local organisations.

Vicar Hugh Wake was urging enrolment on the Church of England roll because the then current list was quite unrepresentative of the parish.

The RBL held their annual dinner in the canteen of the Eastern Electricity Board at Finborough Hall. It was attended by 72 members and guests. Entertainment was provided by the Daffodil Club Concert Party.

The WI appealed to ladies not to sit at home and be lonely - join them in the Pettiward Hall on the second Wednesday in every month....they really are quite friendly.

A luncheon party for the Residents Association was to be held at Finborough Hall on Saturday 25th January at 1pm, the entertainment again to be provided by the Daffodil Club.

Carols had been sung by the Youth Club and a sum of £20 had been raised for Club funds. This was to go towards the purchase of a new fire "which will make the Village Hall life support systems more easily endured during the winter". Also, "Our Ladies already the toast of the county for their dangerous good looks" had won a 4-a side football competition at the Stowmarket Sports Centre.
