PARISH COUNCIL

Points from the meeting 26th July 1989

Further discussions were held with District Council staff concerning proposals to develop about 3 acres of land between Valley Lane and Middlefield Drive for a car park, recreation and some additional housing.

A Public meeting in the Pettiward Hall is to be held on Wednesday, 13th September 1989 at 7.45pm at which Great Finborough parishioners can discuss the proposals with the Parish Council and representatives from the District Council. It is anticipated that each house in the parish will be visited by a Parish Councillor in early September so as to try and ensure that all residents are aware of the matter. Written details of the proposals will be left at the time.

Before a final decision is made, the Parish Council wants to assess the depth of support emongst parishioners for the proposals as they represent a most significant development in the village.

Eastern Counties Buses are to be requested to extend their minibus service during the week up to Borough Lane. Currently, the buses only go as far as Pilgrims Way.

Requests have been made for a new place-name sign for Oak Close and for the pot-holes in the road to be repaired.

The Council received complaints about rubbish being dumped in the ditch opposite the High Road bungalows. This situation is causing the landowner problems with drainage and in cleaning the ditch.

Continued concern was expressed about the increasing use of Combs Lane which is considered to be inadequate to deal safely with the volume of traffic with which it now has to cope. The County Councillor has been asked to bring the hazardous state of the Lane to the attention of the County Surveyor.

Further complaints have been received about cars being parked on the green opposite the Primary School and blocking the line of vision for road users emerging from the Buxhall road onto the B1115. Parents are asked to bear this in mind when parking outside the school during the new term.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held in the Pettiward Hall on Wednesday, 27th September 1989 at 7.30pm.

Mrs. Trudy Gray has been jointly nominated by the Buxhall and Great Finborough Parish Councils as the Minor Authority representative on the Board of Governors of the Primary School to serve from September 1989 for a term of four years.
