The Guides performed a cautionary tale for modern times – none the less enjoyable for that; Brownies threw themselves all over the place in a re-enactment of their prizewinning Sailors' Hornpipe; the St Georges contingent sang lustily and there was the usual Family Service mixture (which is quite unplanned) of order and chaos, hilarity and genuine devotion.

We are told that children are an endangered species, but there seem plenty around at Finborough - enough to reach critical mass for someone to start a Sunday School, perhaps. That's sent you all back into your foxholes, but let's think about it. No one wants to volunteer to do hours and hours a week for evermore. It need only be a light and occasional load if shared sensibly. There is plenty of good material about nowadays. But the need is very urgent, not just for nurturing belief. O ur young people are subject to greater and more insidious influences than ever these days. They need more backup than desperately busy parents can give them, to ensure they stick to a decent and christian path, and that this village remains a safe and pleasant place to live. In theory any group can set about this task, but in practice it is a flourishing Sunday School, which extends its influence to teenagers, that provides the best 'infrastructure for good' in a village. Are there not three or four of you who will take this on? Come out of those foxholes.
