#### CHURCH ROAD - RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT

Following Mr John Grave's report regarding the possible access onto the B1115 from the proposed development in Church Road, I would like to quote some important points sent to me recently from Mr B K Horsted of the Mid Suffolk District Council, relating to comments made about the restricted view when cars are parked along the grass during Church services or other village events, to drivers coming out of the new development. Quote " The land where the parking takes place is a registered village green which I believe is managed by the Parish Council. The fact that parking takes place here would not in itself be in my opinion and adequate reason to resist the residential development" Unquote.

I should point out that so far as I am aware no one is opposed to the development. It is the access from that development onto Church Road, and onto the main B1115 which is at issue, and secondly unless drivers have X Ray eyes when driving out from this site they will not by any stretch of the imagination have the ability to see through a rank of vehicles.

I have in my possession a letter from Mr J J Stansfield, County Surveyor of the highways department dated November 1991 which states, "In my opinion the main safety problem lies with the sub standard visibility where Church Road adjoins the B1115, Stowmarket Rd and this was reflected in my recommendations of refusal to Mid Suffolk District Council. As far as I am aware this application has not yet been determined by the District".

With regards to the tree preservation which is of interest to all, a letter from the Mid Suffolk District Council states, " The mature Oak, Chestnut, and Cherry on the frontage verge outside the walled area and in the Parish ownership, while worthy of preservation are not at risk from the proposed development".

Secondly, I have taken considerable time in locating the access to the site where no damage will occur to significant trees, and have reached an acceptable agreement with the owners over the pond and its unique population of rare crested newts. Thirdly a complete survey of the site was made prior to clearance work taking place and the significant trees required for retention identified to the owners representative, these are the trees remaining on the site. Any development taking place on the site will take account of these trees. Should this prove problematical, then a tree order may be served in order to ensure their retention".

The remarks made about the unique population of newts comes only because of the enormous pressure brought to bear on the Council, by Nature Conservation and other important and influential bodies from much publicity. This pond is now protected by law.

If any resident of Gt Finborough would like to look through the gap in the wall perhaps they might be good enough to let Mid Suffolk Council know of the tree's they refer to "as remaining on the site?".

Readers will note that this campaign has received to date much publicity and backing from many important parties interested in Road Safety and preservation, it is your letters which will bring about a rethink on the safety aspect thus saving a life or lives of our fast moving children and slower moving elderly.

The powers-that-be do not appear to comprehend the future growth in population numbers and car owners with the subsequent deaths this will inevitably cause if the other option of a safer exit is not taken up.

Please write to your M.P., Parish Council or District Council, quoting ref number OL/283/90, with your views.

Do not delay - write today.
