

Great Finborough Community Council

At the meeting on 21 April 2008 the plans for the children's play area were discussed. Team Finborough had met with Gal Travis (MSDC Community Development Officer) & Neil Beales (Project Manager, Gipping Homes) and discussed an interest in skateboarding facilities and the group's application for funding in respect of an all-weather surface for the football pitch. Concern was expressed that numbers of young people attending the Youth Café had dropped since Easter.

John Matthissen, Nick & Cathy Croome, Liz Michie & Mark Brewster, along with Brian Codd, constructed a footpath bridge at the Pear Tree development on 20 April using recycled railway sleepers, etc. *Editor's note: the photos are intriguing!*

The successful construction of the footway between Valley Lane & the Chestnut Horse was noted. The Parish Council has passed a shortlist of suggestions for naming of the new roads to the Primary School.

The task group on the Village Hall reported the architect had been unable to attend a meeting as planned but this will be pursued. Some of the small equipment in the Hall is to be replaced. The next meeting of the Community Council will be on Monday 23rd June.

Aircraft Flight Paths and Stacking - NATS

It is becoming clear that the proposal to stack over Suffolk aircraft awaiting permission to land at Stansted may impose considerable noise on our villages, which are at the edge of the circuit put forward. Information is available at libraries or from www.nats.co.uk/TCNconsultation or TCN Consultation, NATS, Freepost NAT22750 Reading RG1 4BR. Mid Suffolk

District Council have now formally objected. The consultation period has been extended to 19 June, so there is still time to add to the volume of objections.

Planning Applications

If you are considering work that may require planning permission, please get in touch with the planning department at Needham Market at an early stage. We encourage a scheme called "pre-application discussion." This usually involves a planning officer, a member of the parish council and me meeting with the applicant and architect or agent on site, so that everyone understands what is being proposed. Guidance can be provided as to what is likely to be approved, and what is against policy and likely to be refused. There is no fee for this, and it can save the applicant time and money in not submitting applications that will fail, whilst helping to shape schemes with a good chance of acceptance.



Play Your Part by watching out for bogus callers

Suffolk County Council is working with district and parish councils and partners to improve community safety and tackle anti-social behaviour problems across the county, and local people are being encouraged to play their part in making Suffolk safer.

With the warmer weather encouraging doorstep callers onto our streets, residents are being warned to watch out for bogus deals or offers to check services. Statistics show that spring and summer is when unscrupulous traders or thieves posing as officials tend to target unsuspecting householders, some of whom will be elderly or frail.

Suffolk County Council Trading Standards officers are working with Suffolk police, Neighbourhood Watch, Anglian Water and others across the county to protect people from becoming victims of bogus callers.

You can play your part by keeping watch and reporting any concerns by calling Consumer Direct on 0845404050, or contacting your area Safer Neighbourhood Team on 01473 613 500, or visit www.suffolk.police.uk

Remember the four steps to safety:

- LOCK make sure your back door is locked before you go to the front door
- STOP think 'Are you expecting anyone?'
- CHAIN secure the door chain before opening it
- CHECK ask for and double-check the caller's identity. If you are in any doubt, don't let them in.

Tips for dealing with bogus traders:

- Don't agree to any work at your doorstep, or let the job start before you have a chance to change your mind
- Does the work really need doing? If so, shop around and get some quotes and personal recommendations before going ahead.
- A good trader/builder is always in demand, does not need to chase work by knocking on doors and will give you time to consider the estimated price.

• You have a right to cancel any contract signed on the doorstep within seven days. You must be given a cancellation notice with any work. If you are not, the contract is void and no one can force you to pay.

Do you know that about half of all bogus callers claim to be from utility companies such as 'the water board'. Householders can check their identification card is genuine by calling Anglian Water on Freephone 0800 145 145 (24 hours).


When Rover goes roving...from Great Finborough's Resident Vet


Garage Sale

St Andrew's Church From the Ministry Team

Dear Friends,

There's a silly song by *Madness* that I'm rather fond of that includes the line: *I'm as honest as the day is long: the longer the daylight, the less I do wrong.* It probably says something about my sense of humour that it never fails to make me giggle when I hear it.

There is something about the long hours of daylight, though, that does lift the soul. I feel as though I expand with the daylight hours, even when it is not accompanied by the heat we'd like with it. It is a delight to sit down in the evening with the curtains open and rise in the morning to sunshine. When it's accompanied by warmth then the garden door is open into the evening and I can step outside without wrapping up first. When I am sat in the drive as the children blat about on their bikes I greet the dog walkers passing bright eyed and bushy tailed - the walk a joy as well as a duty - and strangers greet one another in the sunlight.

We know we are brighter people in the sunlight: our language reflects it – we talk about being enlightened, or in the dark. Certainly we think of the darkness being peopled with thieves and monsters, doubtful people, people who do not wish to be seen (the 2000 film *Hollow Man* hinges upon the idea that what keeps us moral is the fact that others can see us). I think we are more outgoing in the light as well, more revealed, more open, and more aware of our neighbours.

St John writes this "I am writing you a new commandment that is true in him and in you, because the darkness is passing away and the true light is already shining. Whoever says, 'I am in the light', while hating a brother or sister, is still in the darkness. Whoever loves a brother or sister lives in the light, and in such a person there is no cause for stumbling' (I John 2⁸⁻¹⁰).

He is writing of course not about sunlight, but about – if you'll excuse the pun – Son-light: the light that shines in us as we reflect God; the source of all light. This is the light that enables us to open up and be expansive and available to our neighbours, whatever the weather. This is the light that helps us see our neighbours clearly, however much sunlight shines. This is the light that enables us to look fearlessly at ourselves and see with compassion the darkness that sits within us so that we can root it out.

Rejoice then at the sun that shines within that is warmed so often by the sun that shines without. Let us all work this summer at making ourselves so receptive to it that we can feel it all year round!


