Vets Warn Of Needless Pet Deaths

Cedarwood Veterinary Practice wants to bring to your attention that, despite the fact that cases of Myxomatosis and other potentially killer diseases appear to be on the rise, 3 million dogs, 6 million cats and 1.8 million rabbits are unvaccinated.

Recent research has revealed that nearly two thirds of all vet practices have seen the killer dog disease, parvovirus, in the past year; while 43% have seen leptospirosis, which includes cases seen by the vets at Cedarwood. Leptospirosis, spread by rats, can also be passed on from dogs to people in the form of Weil's disease. As well as the increased risk posed to dogs by the reported rise in the rat population, the ongoing mild winters have increased the risk to rabbits of Myxomatosis, which is spread by biting insects (fleas & biting flies).

Cedarwood Vet Practice, participating in National Vaccination Month (1-30 June 2009), offering dogs, cats and rabbits who are unvaccinated, or whose vaccinations have lapsed, a full vaccination course for the cost of a booster.

Ross Kelly, vet and Great Finborough resident, who owns the Practice says "We feel it's more a need for education than a 'Big Stick' approach. You see, people don't tend to deliberately avoid vaccination. The majority of pet owners lavish affection and presents on their pets, yet some of these same owners are not taking adequate steps to protect their best friends from preventable killer diseases. That's not negligence or lack of care, it's more likely a lack of knowledge that these diseases are out there."

New Down's Syndrome Screening For Mums-To-Be

All women attending Ipswich Hospital and West Suffolk Hospital for antenatal care will now be offered a new screening test for Down's syndrome between the 11^{th} and 13^{th} week of pregnancy.

This new combined test is expected to achieve a detection rate of more than 75% with a false positive rate (saying the baby has Down's syndrome when it has not) of less than 3%. Once screening has taken place, a risk calculation is made that uses a combination of nuchal translucency (NT) measurement and biochemistry.

Women receiving a higher-risk result will be contacted directly and offered further diagnostic testing. For those women who request Down's syndrome screening and who come forward later in the pregnancy a biochemistry triple test will be offered, which is performed at 15-18 weeks.

Hossein Khaled, public health practitioner at NHS Suffolk, said: "As soon as a woman sees her GP she will be encouraged to contact the local midwifery service...should she wish to take up the offer of this new test...It is vital that women are booked and referred to a midwife by 8-10 weeks of pregnancy to ensure that they are screened within the timeframe."
