

# News from the Parish Council Annual Parish Meeting – Monday 10 May

The Annual Parish Meeting takes place on Monday 10 May at 7.00 pm in the Pettiward Hall. This is a public meeting open to all those who live in Great Finborough. It is when local organisations update the community on what they have been doing during the last twelve months and on their plans for the next twelve. It is an important event in the life of our community so please make the time to find out what's going on and come and have your say. All welcome.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be followed immediately afterwards by the Parish Council's Annual Meeting, when officers are elected by Councillors for the final year of this Council's term, prior to next year's Parish Council elections. All welcome. You can come to either or both meetings – your choice.

#### Youth Shelter

I am pleased to confirm that our grant application to Suffolk County Council for £10,000 to provide a Youth Shelter for locating next to the new multi-use games area we hope to install has been successful. The Shelter will be solar-powered and have radio (one volume), wifi and blue tooth technology and the aim is that it will be installed during this Summer. Preparation work is also progressing for the games pitch itself and access for young people will be arranged as soon as there is something to play on and it is safe to do so.

#### Community Council

The Youth Shelter and the Multi-use Games Area are just two of the new facilities that we as a community own. Eventually there will also be allotments, a village field and occasional car park off Valley Lane, and a conservation area with access paths. These are, of course, in addition to the Pettiward Hall, the village greens, the Children's Play Area and the Village Car Park. None of these facilities run themselves, they all require overseeing and maintaining and we are also considering plans to potentially refurbish the Hall.

It was noted the Pre-School needs improved facilities. Concern was expressed that given the School's sporting record, any new hall might not be much available for use by the village.

Canvassing of parents and youth club members for votes for the teen shelter has been undertaken. Now Chris Grady has arranged the use of a website the village appraisal questionnaires will be entered to aid analysis. It was suggested that the car park may benefit from a salt bin next Winter. It was noted that the Parish Council has written to Greene King about the need to get The Chestnut Horse open again. Rodney Self was thanked for sorting out the tree on the triangle opposite the Village School.

#### Decking out to raise money for St Elizabeth Hospice

More than 40 deckchairs designed and painted by celebrities such as Sean Bean, Esther Freud, Anthony Horowitz and Bernard Hill are set to raise money for St Elizabeth Hospice. The deckchairs will spend a summer touring East Suffolk before going under the hammer to raise funds on 1 October. Anthony Horowitz, the author of the best-selling Alex Rider novels, said: "There are far too few hospices in East Anglia in general and this is a great way of raising awareness and money for a terrific cause."

Mr Benn creator Dave McKee, whose deckchair shows the children's cartoon character lounging on a patchwork design, is one of dozens of artists helping to raise money for the hospice, which costs £5.9 million – or £11 a minute - a year to run and cares for patients throughout East Suffolk including the Stowmarket area.

Suffolk Costal Deckchairs is the creation of a 14-strong team, including Ann McBride, who lives in Framsden. Her sister, Sheila, was cared for at home before she died of breast cancer aged 30: a year before St Elizabeth Hospice started its 'Hospice at Home' service. Mrs McBride said: "The inspiration for the project came from one of fundraising team who was buying a deckchair and was struck by the beautiful designs. We got thinking, and wondered if we could incorporate them into a campaign". # Ordinary people providing an Extraordinary Service

On 9 May 2010 the Stowmarket Community First Responders

celebrate five years of service to the community. Since its launch a handful of local residents have given their time and skills providing emergency life saving treatment to the residents of Stowmarket, Stowupland, Combs, Combs Ford, Great Finborough, Buxhall, Shelland, Harleston and Onehouse. These few, who have been trained in basic life support and defibrillation by the East of England Ambulance Trust, attend 999 calls and administer life saving treatment, for a wide range of illnesses, whilst an ambulance is en route. As a result they give the casualty badly needed time to allow the paramedics the chance to put their skills to work, and hopefully save lives.

The group have never had more than 12 volunteers active at any one time with the average being seven. They have given in excess of 25000 hours of their time, on average attending 34 calls every month including to cardiac arrests, heart attacks, strokes and severe asthma attacks. Six members of the public were successfully resuscitated and were taken to hospital with a recordable pulse. A great many more will have received intervention that prevented the condition worsening, or possibly even going into cardiac arrest.

The Stowmarket First Responders, like all Responder groups, are totally self funded. Without the support of several groups, organisations and members of the public, the scheme would have never even got off the ground. Donations have kept the scheme going over the past 5 years. Thank you to everyone who has donated funds to the scheme which have enabled us to continue to provide an essential service to our community.

I would especially like to thank all the volunteers, both past and present, not only for their time and skills given over the years but for their support and encouragement without which my role as coordinator would have been virtually impossible. These few are the true embodiment of what being a community volunteer should be and I am proud to work alongside such dedicated and compassionate people. We are always looking for new volunteers to join the scheme and help fill the gaps in the rota. If you are

## South and Heart of Suffolk Walking Festival 2010: 15 May - 6 June

Why not put a 'spring' in your step and step outside and enjoy the beautiful Suffolk Countryside by taking part in the annual South and Heart of Suffolk 2010 Walking Festival? It will feature around 30 guided walks, in a variety of locations, to suit different tastes and fitness levels. The region, with its softly undulating landscapes, pretty villages and magnificent cultural heritage, is the perfect place to relax and enjoy the fresh air while exploring its countryside on foot.

Walks range from gentle 2-3 mile country rambles and medieval meanders through ancient villages and towns, to longer and more energetic outings of up to 12 miles. Many include lunch and afternoon tea stops with a chance to sample fresh local produce. For others, walkers can bring their own picnic to enjoy along the way.

Four of the walks will be accompanied by poet and storyteller, Dean Park. A photographic walk on 22 May starts out from the Beyond the Image Gallery at Thornham Magna: bring a camera. There is also a chance to visit the sites associated with the famous murder of Maria Marten in the Red Barn at Polstead on 23 May. Special interest outings have also been arranged which include the Wildlife Discovery on 15 May, a circular walk

taking in the habitats at Grove Farm, near Thurston where conservation and farming can be seen working side by side. An early morning walk on 22 May around Arger Fen will watch and hear the dawn wildlife and celebrate the 40th anniversary of the designation of the Dedham Vale Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. This ends with breakfast at the idyllic Assington Mill.

There are also several walks to attract a younger audience too such as, Mister Stevenson's Light Railway on Bank Holiday Monday (31 May) following the route of the 'Middy' to discover how to interpret landscape clues, and also the Scavenger Hunt at Thornham Walks – a gentle afternoon stroll through the woods hunting for a given list of items.



#### From the Ministry Team

Dear Friends, Easter was early this year making the slow emergence of Spring after a cold Winter the more apparent. May should bring both fresh green foliage and flowers in abundance. It can be a time for fresh hope and renewed endeavour. From its start this month is full of

festivals of the Christian faith.

1 May sees the commemoration of the Apostles, Philip and James. The Easter season lasts until Ascension Day, the 40<sup>th</sup> day from Easter Sunday. Always falling on a Thursday this may be why it is barely noticed in the UK although many European countries mark it as a public holiday. The Feast of the Ascension celebrates the change from the risen Jesus having a presence revealed to his followers by appearances in Palestine, to being a sovereign figure hailed by Christians everywhere throughout all ages.

Pentecost, or Whit Sunday, comes 10 days later. 'Pentecost' is Greek for 50, and refers to it being 50 days after Passover. In Christianity it marks the empowerment of the disciples of Jesus to continue his work, so that they spread ever more widely the message of the Kingdom or rule of God, and Christ's resurrection victory.

On Trinity Sunday (30 May), we contemplate the divine revelation in its fullness: the Father the Creator, the Son in whom he took human form, and the Spirit - everywhere present as an aid and influence. Here 'mystery' means truth too deep for any human language adequately to describe.

In the General Election Doubtless the word 'community' has been much used by the parties. This should refer to everyone living in an area, and not any particular group. Politics should be working for the common good of all. Jesus taught about the Kingdom as something both to pray for and work towards achieving. He hinted that the unlikeliest people might count for a lot so we should regard community as including both believers and those who make no open profession of faith, in the hope that all may come to be citizens of God's kingdom.
