

Outgoing Parish Council Chairman's Report – 2009/10 Formal matters

The Parish Council comprises seven councillors. They all live in the village, are unpaid volunteers and do not receive gratuitous expenses. During the year ended March 2010 the Council comprised:

- Richard Brice (Chair)
- Mark Brewster (Vice-Chair)
- Debbie Ball
- Cathy Croome
- Sue Green
- John Matthissen
- Liz Michie.

We have a Parish Clerk, Giles Hill - who is also Clerk to Hitcham Parish Council — and is a paid officer of the PC. (Giles' contact details are in Who's Who). We also have a Village Caretaker, Nigel Pinney, appointed in January.

The Parish Council (PC) met on 11 occasions in the last twelve months. The precept – that is the amount of the rates retained for the Parish – was agreed at £6,100. That means that a Band D property will pay around 40 pence per week towards the Parish. In real terms this has reduced per property for some years. The money is used to pay for local requirements, such as repairs to the Pettiward Hall, street lighting and to build some funds for future development of the Hall and other community facilities.

The PC commented on 13 planning applications in the last year. 11 were supported and two rejected. One of these was for retrospective planning permission for an extension to Plot 116 on the Gipping Homes development. The second was to the drive at Finborough School in Finborough Park which, at the time, we believed should be considered in the context of other prospective developments in the Park.

Local democracy

The PC has carried out a Village Appraisal during the year, the results of which are currently being analysed for subsequent report to the village.

As reported in the Village Newsletter, the PC decided to adopt the power of well being which extends its powers to act in the best interests of the community.

Keeping residents in touch

Ten newsletters were prepared under the editorship of Sally Gooch which are delivered and are free to all households in the village. The newsletter is self-funding by virtue of the advertising it carries. There is also a village website managed by Todd Manning (see Who's Who).

Parish Councillors have also delivered the Mid Suffolk Messenger to residents on behalf of Mid Suffolk District Council.

Representing village views

One of the principal roles of the PC is to represent our neighbours by giving views on, or dealing with, a plethora of subjects. During the last twelve months this has included:

- Speeding and Community Speedwatch
- Hedges
- Footpaths and stiles
- Trees
- Stowmarket development
- School bus
- Dog fouling
- Household waste in litter bins
- Salt bin installation
- Common land
- Play area management
- Provision of allotments
- The Chestnut Horse.

Community facilities

Working closely with the Community Council and, where appropriate, other organisations we have worked hard to improve local facilities, including:

The Play Area

- The car park
- Pettiward Hall there have been a number of minor repairs during the year
- The triangle near the village school, which was refurbished by Suffolk County Council and now has been planted with a Tulip Tree
- The field behind Pear Tree Place, which MSDC has agreed will pass to the PC for the use of the village
- Provision of Welcome Packs for new residents
- We have also won £10,000 funding for a new youth shelter

- Working to identify issues that are important to the lives of the residents you represent
- Working to bring about improvements through local projects, lobbying other service providers and working in partnership with other parishes and agencies.

News from the Community Council *Allotments*

The possibility of using some land behind Pear Tree Place is now not an option. The use of other parcels of land within the village is being investigated.

Village Hall

The architect has requested another meeting to try and move things forward. Discussion again took place regarding the use of the Finborough School's proposed new sports hall. However it was the opinion of those present that we still proceed with investigation into the architect's plans.

Youth Engagement

Numbers are down. The children who attend are mostly in the younger age group. There is also a shortage of helpers. The last bingo session was held in aid of the Youth Engagement and £37 was raised for funds. A youth shelter, for which the parish received funding, will be erected on the bottom field. Also, in time an all weather pitch.

The Car Park

Has been reported as being 'dangerous' in the frost and snow and it was decided to purchase, through the Parish Council, some salt bins for use in Oak Close and Middlefield Drive, as well as the car park, particularly the entrance.

Village Hall

The insurance claim for the fire damage in the kitchen will cover the purchase of a new kettle and microwave. A brand new cooker is being donated. The claim is to be made by the Parish Council.

Tips on avoiding the misery of hay fever

At least 1 in 10 people in the UK suffers from hay fever and for those who suffer with it, the coming Summer months can be a miserable time. By taking a few simple precautions now, in addition to medication, you can minimise your hay fever symptoms. Hay fever is caused by an allergy to pollens. The effects of hay fever can range from being quite mild, to having serious effects on your normal daily life. Common symptoms include a runny, itchy or blocked nose, sneezing and itchy, red, swollen, watery eyes.

The peak season for hay fever is usually May to September. This can vary, depending on where you are in the country and what you are allergic to. There are a number of effective treatments people can buy from their pharmacist including antihistamine medicines in the form of tablet or liquid, inhalers, nasal sprays and eye drops. There are also a number of natural and herbal remedies available from pharmacists and health food shops. You can also take steps yourself to improve your symptoms.

Top tips to avoid the misery of hay fever:

- Keep doors and windows closed when the pollen count is at its highest
- Vacuum and damp dust regularly with a damp cloth to remove any lingering pollen or spores
- Avoid cutting grass, large grassy places, and camping
- Shower and wash your hair after being outdoors, especially after going to the countryside
- Wear wrap-around sunglasses when you are out
- Bring in washing, and close windows before the evening when pollen falls as the air cools
- Keep car windows closed, and consider buying a pollen filter for the air vents in your car.

If you have asthma as well as hay fever you may already have a selfmanagement action plan from your doctor or nurse telling you what to do when your asthma gets worse. For those who don't, speak to your doctor or nurse who can develop a plan with you. By adjusting your asthma medication you could control your symptoms.

- Smear Vaseline inside your nose. It helps stop pollen and spores settling on the lining of your nose
- Regularly splash your eyes with cold water. This will soothe and cool your eyes and will also help to flush out any pollen.
- Keep pets out of the house. Pollen and spores collect on their fur and are likely to carried back into the house.
- Stop people smoking in your home. Smoking and breathing in other people's smoke irritates the lining of the nose, eyes, throat and airways that can make hay fever symptoms worse.

You can be prepared for the effects of hay fever by listening to your local weather forecast, which will list the pollen count as being low, moderate or high:

<u>Low</u> - A low count means that concentrations of pollen in the air will not be high enough to trigger hay fever for the majority of people.

<u>Moderate</u> - A moderate count may mean symptoms for some sufferers, but they shouldn't be too severe.

High - High and Very High counts will cause suffering to most people with hay fever and can be used to judge when to take medication or avoid outdoor activity.

Ancestors in Great Finborough

I have searched the Great Finborough website (which I just love looking at by the way) for contacts in the village as I am interested in family history. Reading some of the names listed on your councils made me smile as I have 'met' their ancestors as I have researched mine. Robert Roper and Charlotte Nunn were married in St. Andrew's Church on 5 April 1860. Charlotte was born in Little Finborough in 1833. They sailed to New Zealand in May 1860, arriving in NZ in August 1860. Poor things - they must have been freezing as it was mid winter!

Robert's father was Richard and his mother was possibly Elizabeth/or Harriet. Children that have Richard Roper listed as father on the marriage certificate were: John Richard Roper (married Susan Proctor at Great Finborough in 1839), Mary Ann Roper (married Joseph Welham at Great Finborough in 1839), Harriet Roper (married John Smith at Little Finborough in 1846) and James Roper (married Ann Gowers at Buxhall in 1855).

Charlotte's father was Robert Nunn and her mother was Mary Harper. They married on 12 October 1831 at Great Finborough. Charlotte's siblings were: William Harper Nunn born about 1831 at Thorpe Morieux (no descendants), John Nunn born 1837 at Little Finborough. The others were born in Combs: Mary Ann Nunn born 1839, Robert Nunn born 1841, Henry Nunn born 1846, George Nunn born 1849 (no descendants).
