

Give your child a healthy start in life Do you qualify for free Healthy Start vouchers?

The Healthy Start Project is a great way to get free vouchers every week which you can swap for milk, fresh fruit, fresh vegetables and infant formula milk. NHS Suffolk is encouraging pregnant women and families with children aged up to four who are in receipt of eligible benefits to apply.

Healthy Start is a great way for women to eat healthily during their pregnancy and gives young children a fantastic start towards a long and healthy life. Having children can be expensive and many people may find it difficult to afford fresh fruit and vegetables, so these free vouchers are an ideal way of saving money and staying healthy at the same time.

You qualify for Healthy Start if you're pregnant or have a child under four years old and you get Income Support, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, or Child Tax Credit and have an annual family income of below £16,190 or less (2008/9). You also qualify if you are pregnant and under 18 years of age.

Healthy Start vouchers are worth:

- £3.10 a week if you're pregnant
- £6.20 a week for each baby aged under one
- £3.10 a week for each child aged over one and under four

You can use your vouchers in any shop that's taking part in the scheme. Look out for the Healthy Start stickers in shop windows, or ask inside. Healthy Start shops include greengrocers, milkmen, market stalls, chemists, corner shops and food co-ops as well as supermarkets.

You can download the application form at www.healthystart.nhs.uk or ask your midwife or health visitor for the form. Complete the form and take it to your GP or midwife for their authorisation. Dr Mashbileg Maidrag, NHS Suffolk Consultant in Public Health Community Wild Space

Everyone is welcome to a public meeting on Tuesday 21 September at 7.30pm at the village Primary School to look at the possibility of creating and looking after a community owned Woodland and Nature Conservation Area in Great Finborough. Grenville Clarke, of the Green Light Trust, will outline the plan and explain how the village can have its own Woodland and Conservation Area for recreation, community events and wildlife. The idea is supported by the Parish Council and the Garden Club, and the land will be given by Mid Suffolk District Council.

The Green Light Trust is an environmental and educational charity which has an exciting scheme called Community-owned Woodlands. They have the expertise and experience to guide and assist the start up and maintenance of the project. More than 23 projects in Suffolk alone, with many elsewhere, have benefitted from their help including ones in Needham Market and Old Newton. Great Finborough could be next.

Such a community owned wild space is run by the community under the guidance of a group of local people with the help of the Green Light Trust. The aim is to give everyone a chance to have a go at planning, planting, coppicing and maintenance of the wood and meadow for the community and wildlife. One aspect of the project is 'Seeds to Trees' where children collect tree seeds and acorns, grow them in a nursery and then plant them in the wood. They can watch them grow all their lives. The Green Light Trust offers training to us in tree planting as well as woodland skills like coppicing, hedge laying and live willow weaving.

If there are enough people who are interested in coming to the meeting a group can be formed. Then the fun starts by working with the community and forming a new Wild Space for Great Finborough.

As you may have heard, the Bakehouse at Haughley won its battle with Haughley Parish Council for

access and services shown to be in existence since 1189AD. The Council had threatened to force the closure of the ancient business on the village green by denying it access and services. However, shortly before legal proceedings commenced, the Council and with Mr Jeffery Bowden capitulated and asked for terms of settlement withdrawing their objections made under two Victorian Acts of Parliament ending this six year endeavour. The Council, which had been consistently advised not proceed, had spent nearly £50,000 or 125% of its annual budget on this matter and have since been ordered to pay Palmers' legal costs.

Palmers was deeply touched when over 20,000 people turned out in an unprecedented show of support when the Bakehouse and its shops were threatened with closure. It shows that there is still, alive and well, a community spirit. The future of the Bakehouse, its jobs and local shops is now secure so on behalf of Palmers, its staff and family, thank you for restoring its faith in human nature, kindness, decency and common sense.
