

## **News from your District Councillor** *The Forge Traveller Site*

For those of us living on Combs Lane, Finborough Road and Wash Lane, the uncertainty regarding The Forge caravan site has resurfaced again. I am setting out some of the history and constraints to better inform everyone.

In 1982 the site was given planning permission for gypsy and traveller caravan use by a Planning Inspector following an appeal and public enquiry. I have heard that there were one or two problems on the site in the 1980's or 1990's but have no knowledge of how it was managed during that period. The owner succeeded in gaining planning permission for 5 houses in the late 1990s but these were never built and that permission lapsed after 5 years. This was re-applied for in 2005, and consultation of 12 addresses around the site, as well as Finborough and Onehouse Parish Councils, took place. The application was refused because "there is a demonstrated need for permanent private gypsy sites in the area..." with the Parish Council and 4 others all objecting to housing on various other grounds.

When I came to the neighbourhood in 2001 the site was well-used and relatively trouble free, but came to suffer from an absence of proper management, the departure of traveller families and occupation by various people who presented a range of social difficulties. When I was elected in 2007 the site had become a major source of problems as many of you will be aware. Anti-social behaviour including noise, fires (including several entire caravans), police visits on various matters, squatters and water pollution had grown to unacceptable levels. With help I removed the burned-out caravan that had disfigured the corner for several years. As councillor I pursued a multi-agency approach to curtailing these problems, working with the Police, County Council, Environment Agency and various departments of Mid Suffolk District Council, and we achieved a quieter life for us all in recent times.

The District Council Local Development Framework (LDF) was adopted in 2008 after extensive public consultation, including policies to provide more traveller pitches in accordance with the (now defunct)

regional plan. Locally and more widely, these policies were based on evidence of need. To implement policy the Council has looked first at sites with existing planning permission, such as The Forge. In fact, on considering this, the Council decided a reduction from 18 to 12 pitches would be right. However, because the site was in poor condition, underused (owner not allowing travellers) and not responsibly managed, the Council proposed to achieve greater control of the site, if necessary through purchase.

This intention was included in the Stowmarket Area Action Plan which has been the subject of several phases of public consultation over the last 18 months. These moves need to be seen in a context of spasmodic occupation by travellers of unauthorised sites around Mid Suffolk, giving rise to local concern and much expense of Council staff time and legal costs. Accordingly the Council is also looking for suitable new sites to make additional provision to meet its legal obligations.

At Wattisfield, unauthorised occupation of land by travellers has been upheld by a Government Planning Inspector, despite being in a designated special landscape area, because Mid Suffolk DC had not allowed sufficient approved pitches in the district. There is a perverse risk that stopping traveller designation of The Forge could lead to appeal decisions to allow traveller sites elsewhere, possibly even on the adjacent field. For the reasons outlined I do not think there is any prospect of The Forge site being used for any other purpose. Housing development is no longer permitted due to policy changes emphasising flood risk, which is increasing with climate change, and stricter controls on development in the countryside.

An anonymous leaflet circulated locally suggests I have "yet to offer any kind of support to local residents in this matter." In practice, The Forge has taken more time than any other issue over the three years I have been your Councillor; most of it spent pressing various authorities for action to control nuisance from the site. Latterly my efforts have been to encourage purchase of the site, as a way of gaining control and limiting the huge waste of public money repeatedly trying to stop problems such as those of 2007/2008.

Clearly, living within a few yards of The Forge, I share the experiences that have caused concern, and approach the issue, and all my council work, by seeking the best possible outcome for the people I represent. That approach necessarily places as much emphasis *on possible as on best*, which is why I have not campaigned for the traveller site to be removed, an outcome which might be wished for by many, because I have seen absolutely no prospect of it happening.

#### The essential facts are:

- The intention of the Council to buy the site and retain it in traveller use has been public for 18 months, as part of consultations about the Stowmarket Area Action Plan
- The Council is seeking to reduce pitches from 18 to 12, accommodated on a very slightly larger area, while ensuring the remainder of the land remains countryside
- Public sentiment is not allowed to decide planning issues only material planning considerations
- The money to fund a Council purchase has already been allocated within existing budgets, and will not be affected by future cuts
- The policy to continue traveller use of the site is driven by local need, established by independent survey and strengthened by unauthorised encampments in the district being given planning approval by appeal inspectors, because Mid Suffolk had not approved sufficient traveller pitches
- The current landowner has been an absentee landlord, allowing much misuse to the detriment of local people
- Recent Government policy changes relate to the creation of new traveller sites and the closure of unauthorised sites, not to land with existing permission for traveller use.

#### Merger with Babergh District Council

Major organisational change dominates the Council agenda at present. Parish Councils have received a preliminary letter about the Mid Suffolk/Babergh merger. More detail is to come. Only one MSDC councillor voted against, although I understand there was more opposition at the Babergh meeting. Officers of both Councils are now working in more detail on merging the two organisations under a

single Chief Executive. Merger of the Councils will be subject to a public referendum in May 2011, on a proposal to elect a single Council to take over in May 2013. This means that parish and district elections will definitely be held on 5 May 2011. Councillors have also voted to go ahead with a Shared Revenue Partnership, which will be responsible for Council Tax collection and benefit payments across MSDC, Babergh and Ipswich. #### **CUTS HEADLINES**

#### • About 490,000 public sector jobs likely to be lost

Reform of public sector pensions to save £1.8bn by 2015, with employees likely to contribute more.

#### • Councils will see a 7.1% annual fall in their budgets.

But ring-fencing of local authority revenue grants will end and councils will have freedom to borrow against their assets. Funding for social housing to be cut by more than 60%, with new tenants having to pay higher rents. But the government hopes these changes will free up funds to build 150,000 new affordable homes over the next four years.

#### • £2billion extra for social care by 2014/15

Sure Start budget to be protected in cash terms.

#### • NHS budget in England to rise every year until 2015

The NHS in England will see its budget rise by 0.4% over the next four years. New cancer drug fund to be provided but £20billion in efficiency and productivity savings sought in NHS by the end of the parliament.

#### • Benefits

A further £7billion in welfare savings planned on top of £11bn already announced. A new 12-month time limit on the Employment and Support Allowance (replacement for Incapacity Benefit) could see 200,000 claimants moved onto Jobseekers Allowance and see their support reduced. Proposed 10% cut in Council Tax benefit budget. Under-35s only able to claim housing benefit for a room rather than a whole property. Maximum savings award in pension credit to be frozen for four years. Increased working hours threshold for working tax credits for couples with children. New total benefits cap per family. Winter fuel allowance, free bus passes and TV licences for 75-year-olds protected. Cuts to child benefit for higher rate taxpayers to generate £2.5bn. £2billion investment in new universal credit. Weekly child element on child tax credit to rise by £30 in 2012 and £50 by 2012.

#### • Retirement age to rise from 65 to 66 by 2020

State pension age for men to start rising from 65 in 2018 - six years earlier than planned - and reaching 66 by 2020. Rise in retirement age for women to accelerate, also reaching 66 by 2020. The measures combined will save £5billion a year.

#### • English schools budget protected

Direct funding to schools in England is to be protected. Their budget will rise 0.1% in real terms each year, taking funding from £35bn to

£39bn. But spending on school buildings to fall 60%. Confirmed £2.5bn "pupil premium" for teaching for disadvantaged pupils. Educational Maintenance Allowances to go.

#### • Police and Justice

Police funding cut by 4% a year. Aim to maintain "visibility and availability" of officers on beat but some experts believe 18,000 police jobs could be lost. UK Border Agency budget to fall 20%. Counter-intelligence budget to fall 10%. Plan for new 1,500-place prison to be dropped. 3,000 fewer prison places expected by 2015. £1.3bn capital investment in prison estate

#### • Defence

The RAF and navy will lose 5,000 jobs each, the Army 7,000 and the Ministry of Defence 25,000 civilian staff. The Harrier jump jets and the Ark Royal aircraft carrier are being axed while the planned Nimrod spy planes will be cancelled. Key spending decision on Trident to be delayed until 2016.

#### • Transport

Crossrail project to go ahead in London. Rise in regulated cap on rail fares to 3% above inflation for three years from 2012.


