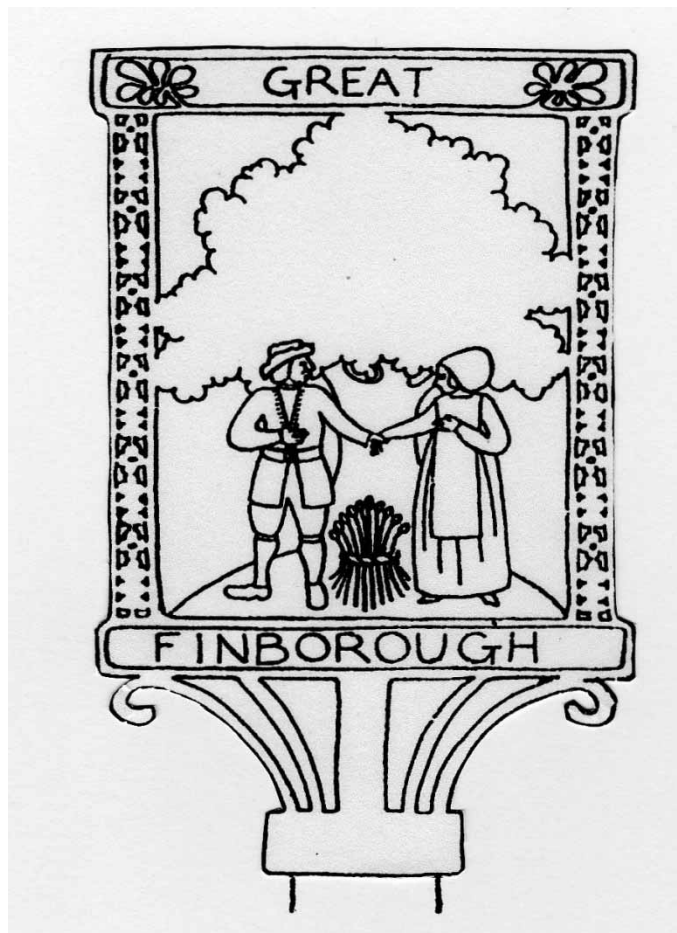

News from the Parish Council

The last meeting was held on 6 June 2011. Issues discussed included:

- The woodland area's ownership has yet to be transferred to the Parish and remains owned by Mid Suffolk District Council.
- Councillors made a plan for the repair of the car park barrier.
- The meeting approved the accounts of the Parish Council.
- Peter Turner was appointed as the key holder for Pettward Hall. Richard Brice was thanked for having continued holding this responsibility until now.
- Responsibility for ensuring that Pettward Hall's accounts are reviewed was assigned to two Councillors.
- Ian Cameron accepted lead responsibility for becoming expert in all matters relating to the Ravenscroft development.
- The planning application for an extension at Keeper's Cottage was supported.
- The Council will seek someone to replace Les Sheldrake's work litter picking. Thanks were extended to him as he declined to be paid. Anyone who is interested in doing this on a voluntary or paid basis should contact Bryony Allen or me.

The main work undertaken by Councillors in June has been the installation of the Youth Shelter commissioned by the last Council. The Youth Shelter was delivered by *Monster Play* on the agreed date at a cost of £10,000. In view of the additional cost of paying for its installation, Councillors decided to save the £900 and install it themselves. Over three days in June they dug the footings, mixed the concrete and put up the shelter ready for the young people of the village to enjoy it in the school Summer holidays.

The Shelter, accessed from Valley Lane and Pear Tree Close via Woodpecker Hill wood, is adjacent to the pitch that has been laid down by Gipping Homes. As well as providing a football pitch, it is a level grassed area with its own small car park and it will be used for village events. Take a walk and have a look. The grass is still young so let it settle down before it is used heavily please. Those of you letting your dogs foul the pitch and other parts of the site need to stop.



The Shelter will be ready for use by 3 July and will have bluetooth with power from its solar panels. Feedback to Councillors on this whole area would be appreciated.

The Councillors have also met with the newsletter's editor to discuss editorial policy and the delivery of the newsletters by Councillors. It was agreed that advertising rates will stay the same for now and no change to editorial policy was proposed. This is one way of collaring us about any issue to do with village life on which we may be able to help you, so take the opportunity and get to know your Parish Council.

There has been one expression of interest to date in the vacancy for a Parish Councillor. More are encouraged. A decision will be made at the next meeting on 11 July. If you may be interested please speak to any of the Councillors or the Clerk. All villagers are welcome to attend all Parish Council meetings. Next meetings are 5 September and 7 November.

If the court proceedings fail, the family is split up: the husband sent to prison, the wife deported and the children sent to a 'home'. One of the memorable experiences of Michael's stay in the UK was hearing Jose Henriquez, one of the Chilean miners; and Church Mission Society partner, Alf Cooper, who is also Protestant chaplain to President Pinera of Chile. Jose spoke about the '34th man' – Jesus – whom the 33 rescued miners had experienced being with them through their 69-day ordeal.

Fred Dubery RIP

The distinguished painter, Fred Dubery, lived amongst us for over 40 years. His death on 8 April 2011 was mourned by many friends and colleagues at his funeral at St Andrews, Great Finborough, on 21 April. A tribute in the East Anglian Daily Times on 16 April by Ian Collins outlined his career as a painter and lecturer. He was a visiting tutor at the Royal Academy Schools, where he was Professor of Perspective, and the Royal College of Art, where he was concurrently a part-time senior lecturer. He was elected a member of the New English Art Club in 1956 and subsequently became a life member.

Fred loved Suffolk. He and his wife, Joanne, revelled in the landscapes around them. Suffolk light inspired many of Fred's memorable paintings. Ian Collins says of him "Suffolk scenes would be much celebrated, but the work always returned to details (a table corner, a mantelpiece edge)". Several of Fred's pictures will appear in an exhibition at the New English Art Club at Messum's in Cork St, London W1S 3LJ, which is open to the public from 15 June to 9 July 2011.

As a man Fred was quiet and modest, with a painter's eye for detail and a wonderful sense of humour. He was a devoted husband, and was greatly loved by his colleagues and ex-students. Our sympathies are with Joanne, who was his wife, companion and inspiration.

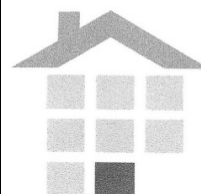

From the Team


Over the last week I have been prompted by articles I have read about taking time to rest. Now that the Summer is here many will be able to take some rest, or at least change the pattern of their day. We often ask people to slow down for their own sakes but are not good at taking that advice for ourselves.

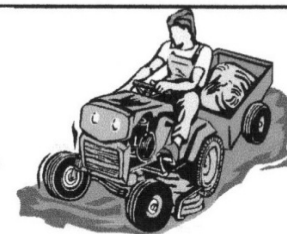
