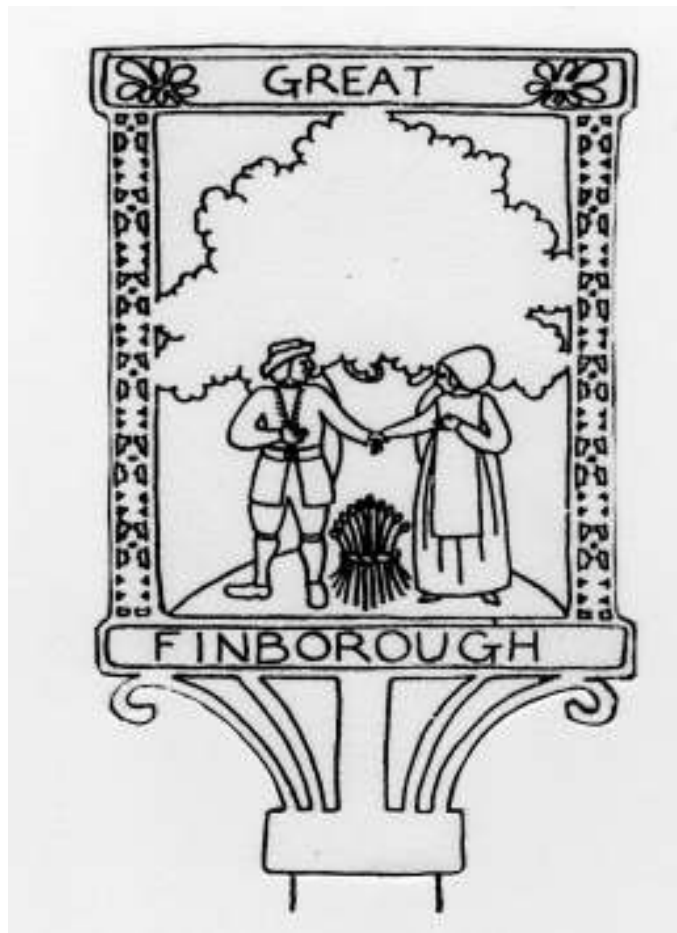

News from your District Councillor

Air sourced heat pumps

Over recent months Mid Suffolk District Council has been installing air sourced heat pumps in its Council houses, replacing old oil-fired central heating boilers. Almost 200 of these have now been installed, and the first locally will soon be going into houses in Buxhall. The brand chosen, Mitsubishi, was selected because it is the most efficient currently available and is also the quietest. Working similarly to a refrigerator except in reverse, it converts 1 kilowatt of electricity into between 3 and 4 kilowatts of heat. This brings benefits to tenants in the form of less expensive heating bills, to the council through lower maintenance costs, and to the planet which suffers less carbon emissions. Tenants in other parts of the district seem to have been satisfied with the results. Funding is being sought to continue this programme of replacement, as part of the Council's measures to tackle fuel poverty and climate change. I hope to see more installations locally.

The Forge Caravan Site

As you have probably read in the newspapers, the owner approached residents of the Dale Farm travellers' site with a view to selling The Forge. The Council is continuing to pursue compulsory purchase as the best way of ensuring proper management of the site.

Our local churchyards are, undoubtedly, very special places. We return to remember our loved ones, and it is right that we tend their graves. St. Andrew's, like Buxhall and Onehouse's churchyards, have management plans under the guidance of the Suffolk Wildlife Trust whereas Shelland and Harleston are kept neatly trimmed. All the churchyards require a lot of maintenance and conservation, and we are grateful to those in our communities who devote time and bring their expertise to bear – as we all enjoy a country churchyard, whether we are believers or not.

What most of us do not know is that the rules governing what can, and what cannot be done in a churchyard are strict. Local parishes have very little discretion. We are obliged to follow the rules published by the diocesan authorities. Each church has a copy of the rules on display. If you need further information, or are thinking of making any changes to your family's graves, please talk to me or to one of the Churchwardens first to ensure that what you would like to do can be accommodated within the rules. **Rev Chris Childs**

News from the Village School

A warm welcome to the parents and carers of our new children in Green Class! The children have made an excellent start and are already settling in well to the school. It is great to see them around school with smiles on their faces, and already setting a high standard of behaviour. We also like to extend a warm welcome to Mr Smith, who has started his first term at our school with our youngest children.

Each term I hold Pupil Progress Meetings with every class teacher to discuss the individual progress of each child. This is part of our monitoring process to ensure that every child is making the most progress possible for them as individuals. Parent/Carer evenings have been set for Tuesday 11 October and Wednesday 12 October.

In Green Class, the theme for our first topic of the year is 'People who help us'. We aim to invite into the classroom as many people from the various professions as possible, and as a class we will develop questions that we would like to ask them. A big thank you to Stuart Wade who has very kindly commissioned and donated a beautiful woodworking bench to Green class. We hope to utilise this to further develop the various skills that each child will learn at Forest school on Tuesday's, and plan to offer woodcraft as an activity that all children can access during their self-initiated independent play should they wish.

Our news in Blue Class is that, over the Summer, we have had a blue makeover in the classroom. It is bright and clean and to a new paint a carpet we have added a new teaching team and a new cohort of pupils. Our first topic is 'underground'. We're going to be finding out about the world beneath our feet and what we can learn from the past by delving down deep. We have a real archaeologist in the classroom and will be getting our hands dirty in search of clues from the past. We plan to dig some test pits in the school grounds!



In Red Class we are learning more about sea creatures and are going on a class trip to the Sea-life Centre in Great Yarmouth. We welcome

any seaside artefacts in the classroom and especially any unwanted shells we could use for collage.

Hospital equipment for Uganda

There is a health clinic in Mbale, a town in south-east Uganda, which lacks basic equipment, such as beds, laboratory apparatus, and wheelchairs. Aid for Hospitals Worldwide is a Christian charity based in Bury St Edmunds which supplies medical equipment to hospitals in the developing world free of charge. There is a charge for the equipment to be checked, serviced, and packed prior to transport. A list of medical equipment has been agreed to go to the health clinic in Mbale.

Tools with a Mission (TWAM) is a Christian Charity based near Ipswich involved in the repair and servicing of a variety of tools and equipment and their transport by shipping container to a number of countries, particularly in Africa. The medical equipment will be part of a container load being sent by TWAM from UK to Uganda, for which there will be a shipping charge. Transport has to be arranged and paid for, to get the medical equipment from the dock to the health clinic in Mbale. Total funds needed are estimated at £5,000.

From the Team: A Notable Anniversary

October 23 is Bible Sunday. There will be a service of Choral Evensong for the Stowmarket Deanery at St Mary's Buxhall at 6.30pm, with an address by the Archdeacon of Sudbury. This year sees the 400th anniversary of the issue of the King James Bible in English. This version of the Scriptures has been a major influence on English language and literature and far beyond its purely religious value.

It was not the first complete translation, since Miles Coverdale had made one by stealth back in 1535, but none had previously been had Royal authority or been appointed to be read in churches. There have been various translations since, with the benefit of advances in scholarly research. The modern linear descendent of the King James Bible can be said to be the New Revised Standard Version; an American work, of which the Anglicised edition is officially set by the Church of England for use with Common Worship services in modern language.

The Bible is best seen as being not a single book, or even a work of two parts - the Old and New Testaments - but rather a collection of various sorts of writing. From ancient myth and legend, through chronicled historic events, ancient codes of Law, prophecies, and poetry, to the unique set of portraits of the life and teaching of Jesus comprised in the Four Gospels, with letters and visionary writing by his first followers. Benefit can be had from straightforward reading and listening, but even more may be gained from study of the background and context. So let us give thanks, and use the Word well.
