

News from the Parish Council

At the Parish Council meeting on 10 December 2012, discussion and decisions included:

- Cllr Matthissen reported that the Chilton Leys' developer is attempting to push ahead with the first 200 houses, whilst MSDC is trying to ensure that a comprehensive plan for the whole development is agreed before allowing work to start.
- Cllr Matthissen confirmed that the bid for grant money for the Forge site is described as a 'community bid' and seeks to increase the pitches to 20 from the current 19. The bid is awaiting a government decision.
- A pre application discussion took place in relation to a proposal to erect a new dwelling adjacent to *Hillside*.
- It was agreed that no further comment be submitted to the planning inspectorate for the appeal process for the erection of bungalow and garage at *Hilmic*.
- The MSDC tree officer has inspected the trees in Church Road and has advised that they pose no safety issue but agreed that some work could be carried out to improve them. The tree officer recommended that a regular inspection of all council owned trees should be commissioned by a professional consultant but MSDC does not provide this service. It was agreed that the first step in the management of all trees owned by the Parish Council was to carry out a full survey, and to establish a contingency fund within the budget process in order to maintain effectively the trees and hedgerows that are the responsibility of the Council.
- It was noted that the work to the church wall had been carried out slightly under budget.

At the Parish Council meeting on 14 January 2013, discussion and decisions included:

- A resident expressed concern regarding the slippery surface at the entrance to the car park. Cllr Turner will assess whether any action can be taken.
- A survey of all benches will be undertaken.

- It was resolved to send a No Objection response to the application to erect a garden shed at *The Butterfly*, Borough Lane.
- The blinds have been put up at Pettiward Hall and feedback regarding the recent renovation has been very positive. The working group's next meeting on 28 January would fix a date for the Annual General Meeting at which proper trustees will be appointed.
- MSDC has agreed to take the Government's incentive grant again and freeze Council Tax and it proposes increasing council house rentals by 4%.
- The precept for 2013/14 was set at £7,184 and based on the tax base calculation of 295.91 received from MSDC, will represent an increase of only £4.20 for the year in the Parish Council part of the council tax for a Band D property. It was noted that MSDC has promised a grant of £362. The Budget Working Group was thanked for its work on the budget, which ensured that the whole process of setting the precept had been improved.
- Cllr Burns will liaise with the tree warden to get the tree and hedge survey underway. It was agreed that the ivy on Church Road trees be removed on the MSDC Tree Officers recommendation.
- It was agreed that the current car park signage is confusing for users, in that the car park is not actually shut at the times stated. This is not helpful when events are held, and makes for under use of the car park when it is a community asset to be used. It was agreed that a community consultation process be carried out in March.
- It was noted that a petition style letter had been received from the youth requesting a skate facility, and that it will be discussed at the next meeting.

The next Parish Council meeting is on Monday 11 February at 7.30pm in the upstairs room of Pettiward Hall. You are welcome to attend.

News from your District Councillor District Council Budget 2013/14

It is proposed that Mid Suffolk District Council, despite further reductions in Government funding, should freeze Council Tax again next year, using money set aside from the New Homes Bonus to support growth, economic generation and its strategic priorities. It is proposed to create a £200,000 community fund for town and parish councils. At the same time Mid Suffolk has had to find yet further savings of £1.3m and reduce costs again next year. This is on top of savings of nearly £4m that have been made over the last four years.

Recycling

Textile recycling has got off to a good start so please do not put any clothes, curtains, bed linen, shoes, etc. in your black bin. Instead please take good stuff to one of the charity shops; and put the rest in one of the special textile bags before placing into your green wheelie. The bin men should leave you another bag, but if not please contact me as I have a stock of spares. Batteries can now be recycled at both Solar and Asda, and possibly in other places as well.

Does Anyone Know Robert Wassell?

Great Finborough locals may have noticed the sound of an unfamiliar bell ringing in recent weeks. For any curious residents, it is the sound of the bell ringing in the clock tower that sits above The Coach House in the grounds of Finborough School.

What started as a simple job to fix a leaky ceiling under the clock tower soon developed into a full restoration project. Under the expert guidance of carpenter, Gary



Ellis, and clockmaker, Anthony Clements, we looked on as, day by day, it was restored to its former glory. We think it is the first time that the clock has worked or the bell has sounded for at least 20 years. During the project we uncovered a poem written on the inside of the tower... *The Rubaiyat of Omar Khayyam:*

The Moving Finger writes; and, having writ, Moves on: nor all thy Piety nor Wit Shall lure it back to cancel half a Line, Nor all thy Tears wash out a Word of it.

It was translated into English in 1859 by Edward Fitzgerald but was penned inside the clock tower in 1906 by one Robert Wassell. We would be very interested to hear from anyone who knew him? We think he may have restored the clock tower at some point but it would be great if anyone could tell us anything interesting about the past. Many thanks.

News from St Nicholas Hospice



Thefts

There have been a number of shed break ins and thefts from motor vehicles in the last month within the village. If you have any information that you may feel would be of use then please let us know. Please keep outbuildings locked and keep anything of high value indoors where practical.

If you have a '4x4', in particular a Ford Ranger, these have been targeted, particularly around Needham Market, for their catalytic converters. There have been several arrests, people have been charged and others are currently on bail for such offences.

Telephone Scams

Here some tips to avoid being a victim of telephone scams:

- Don't give out any personal details or 'conf irm' them if unsure of the source.
- Never enter your PIN into the handset; your bank will never ask for this.
- Never share your PIN with anyone.
- Do not pay money until you have checked the credentials of the company, including sending money abroad or using methods of payment that you are not comfortable with.
- Do not give out your personal, credit card or online account details over the phone unless you made the call.
- If you receive a phone call from someone you don't know, always ask for the name of the person you are speaking to, who they represent, and verify this.
- Do not reply to unsolicited texts, such as those referring to accident claims, even to get them stopped. Simply delete them.
- It is best not to respond to missed calls that come from numbers you do not recognise. You may be charged a higher rates if you answer them and this can turn out to be very expensive.

To help reduce marketing calls, sign up to the Telephone Preference Service. TPS is a free service which records your preference not to receive unsolicited sales or marketing calls. It is a legal requirement that all organisations (including charities, voluntary organisations and political parties) do not make such calls to numbers registered on the TPS unless they have your consent to do so.
