



Nature's Bounty

A sunny and warm morning in the beginning of October I went with my daughter, Hanna, to Park Cottage to watch apple pressing for the first time in my life. They had started the process of making apple juice with the kind help of Dave AND Caroline Williams, and their team, and there were already about 15 grown-ups and 8 children in the garden. For those of you who don't know how to press apples, this is how it is done:

Wash the apples, take away bad ones. Put the apples twice in a garden shredder to make pulp; a thick mass of apples including peel, pips and pulp. Then put the pulp in the presser on clean bed sheets inside a wooden frame and wrap the cloth around it. These are called 'cheeses' and actually looked like big, fat cheeses. Put beech slats between every cheese. You can have two to five cheeses on top of each other in each pressing. Apply some pieces of wood at the top and, using a winder, start applying the pressure. After a few minutes open the tap and the juice gushes into a clean container. Drink the juice at once; freeze it for later use; or make cider.

Those of us who did not work the press could sit and enjoy a talk with a neighbour in the sunshine, have some tea, bacon or sausage in rolls, or a cup of soup. There was table tennis and a trampoline for the children, and Ruby the dog to cuddle. Thank you, everyone, for a very enjoyable day!

A Letter from Sunnyside

It is November and Remembrance Day services fall on the tenth this year. I have been busy helping at Combs in the absence of a priest in charge there this Summer so I will be taking their service. I wonder what you think



about in the 2 minutes' silence? Would you ever confess to an absence of thoughts about war and peace - maybe wondering what's for lunch, or will the person in charge get the timing right? My anxious agony to start the silence spot on 11am means that all I can think of is a sense of relief that it was done, and watching the clock for the end. Not what we are meant to be remembering is it, so thankfully there are plenty of opportunities in the rest of the service. I love it when we can have a trumpeter, don't you? Those spine tingling notes as the silence ends.

Remembering in itself can be a passive thing, especially for those of us who have never had to experience war close at hand. It is not very productive just to stand and let snapshots of war films and TV news fill your mind. But we remember to understand the horrors of war, the sacrifices made, the lives lost, those unforgettable rows of gravestones and line upon line of names on memorials.

And if we do what we are meant to on Remembrance Day and understand, then it may help us to move forward. WWI was supposed to be the war to end all wars but we know that aims of peace and prosperity for all were nothing but a dream. We are still faced daily with wars and rumours of wars. We have to look forward, not dwell in the past, and have faith and hope in the future. Our poppies remind us of new life springing up from the battlefields. Through education, travel, friendship across nations and indeed through the prayers of faithful people we can work together to make a dream come true.

Check your oil

With the clocks going back and the temperature cooling, we often see an increase in heating oil thefts. By taking a few simple steps you can help make your tank and fuel more difficult for thieves to target. Screen your tank with fencing or hedges, close and secure any gates leading to the tank, conceal or cover any external pipes and fuel lines, install dusk to dawn security lighting, install lockable caps supported by a closed shackle padlock, regularly check your fuel levels AND consider installing a tank alarm. I have just done this on mine!
