

There are many events happening in our communities including fetes, flower festivals, concerts, suppers, breakfasts and the like, but for us it is also a year of centenaries. The start of the 1st World War will be



commemorated in Buxhall and Great Finborough on Monday 4 August. It will incorporate displays or memorabilia particularly from the Red Cross Hospital that was in Finborough Hall. Both schools in Finborough are arranging displays and the Buxhall and Shelland fete will doubtless attract large interest in their display in St Mary's. International events are brought to reality by the effect they have on people's lives. Come and see remember and think.......


At the other end of the scale are the celebrations marking the formation of this Diocese and those of Ely and Norwich. All started with a contemporary Eucharist in the cathedral in March where Archbishop Justin Welby was welcomed by children with flags and banners before being interviewed by others on such topics as diverse as prayer and gay marriage. Drama illustrated the first bible reading and the cathedral resounded to the sound of a specially arranged youth orchestra with nearly 1,000 voices led by their ladies choir. Pomp and formality it was not. The Gospel being read by the senior verger and processions were minimal. Choral evensong reached a capacity congregation with a more traditional format.

Diocesan celebrations are brought to reality by the effect they have on people's lives in the parishes: encouraging, celebrating and inspiring all that we have and share. If you are feeling jaded and some are – come and see......for it all begins with you.... I am hoping to be able to show the DVD of the services in the Cathedral at St Andrew's Church at some stage in the future.

There are two further special services to celebrate the Diocesan Centenary being held at Ipswich Regent on 6 July. I hope many of us will be able to join in. Tickets can be obtained from the Regent Box Office in person, by telephone to 01473 433100 or at www.ipswichregent.com. There are arrangements for booking on line

and free child places. I have further details as does the Diocesan website.

Stowmarket Deanery - 19 parishes from Buxhall to Wickham Skeith and Wetherden to Combs - is planning a mini pilgrimage. Each parish will walk to Stowupland on Saturday 16 August for tea and a short service. I hope all will be represented even if some more outlying parishes like Buxhall and Little Finborough only make it to their neighbour. It would be good if the Great Finborough group, perhaps with Little Finborough, could combine with Onehouse at Onehouse for the final push into Stowmarket. Enjoying the beauty of Finborough Park and its quiet footpaths rather than the B1113 is the plan. Simon Tarabella is our co-ordinator and there will be more details in due course. Come and see, join in, and be uplifted in all that we do. The beautiful weather helps us all.

Great Finborough Neighbourhood Watch Police Direct

GFNW covers quite a large area and rapid communications are difficult, so I have always encouraged Members to sign up to Police Direct so they can receive early information of incidents that may affect them. If you have access to a computer and would like to receive this sort of information by email as it becomes available, log on to www.suffolk.police.uk and follow the link to Police Direct to register for this free service. If you do not have computer access you can phone 01473 613997 and once registered you will receive recorded telephone or text messages.

Police Direct has its shortcomings and I have been advised that "it is not automatically linked in any way to our main crime information system. It relies on officers and staff to make selections on what is to be posted on Police Direct. They do so by asking Police Direct staff to post these messages. Many categories will be excluded, such as crimes/investigations that are regarded as sensitive, or crimes where 'no publicity' has been requested". However I feel that any information is better than none!

Neighbourhood Watch Newsletter

Another way of receiving information is via the Mid-Suffolk region's Neighbourhood Watch Newsletter. Apart from local crime information summaries, these newsletters provide important crime reduction and safety information, notification of meetings and events, and links and contact information. The newsletters are generally issued fortnightly, but this may vary depending on content. This is a free service but you will need computer access to receive it, you can register via the following link: http://www.suffolkneighbourhoodwatch.co.uk. Great Finborough is covered by the Mid Suffolk South Newsletter but you can subscribe to all of them if you wish.

But most importantly, remember what Great Finborough Neighbourhood Watch is all about: keeping an eye on our neighbours' properties! **John Davey**

New Community Paediatric Asthma and Epilepsy Nurses

Children with asthma and epilepsy in west Suffolk are set to benefit from the appointment of two new hospital-based community facing specialist asthma and epilepsy nurses. The two posts are funded by the NHS West Suffolk Clinical Commissioning Group and will be delivered in partnership with West Suffolk Hospital. Both nurses will provide support to children with asthma or epilepsy and their families so they will be able to manage their condition with confidence.

There are around 920 children with asthma and 250 with epilepsy in west Suffolk. For these children and their families it can be difficult and sometimes frightening to deal with the consequences of these conditions. By linking with families and primary care the nurses will be able to offer the help patients need to manage their long term condition on a daily basis. If patients have the right level of knowledge and support they can effectively manage their long term condition and avoid the need to see their GP or have an unplanned admission to hospital.

The nurses will benefit from being based at West Suffolk Hospital, supporting them to provide an outreach service to children and young people in the community whilst offering educational support and advice to practice nurses within primary care. We want children with asthma or epilepsy to live their lives as normally as possible. By working in partnership with West Suffolk Hospital and local GP practices the nurses will be able to offer a seamless level of continuous care for those children with asthma or epilepsy and their families.

Hello Everyone...

There have been two crimes since my last report. Overnight on 31 March a vehicle had its rear windscreen smashed but nothing was stolen. Overnight on 14 April a Vauxhall Brava pickup was stolen; the third of this type recently.

Since 1 October 2013 there have been 18 offences where elderly victims have been targeted and bank cards/money have been stolen in public or supermarket car parks in Suffolk. Suspects seem to identify victims either in the store or at the ATM machine outside and watch them as they enter the PIN on their bank card. While they load their shopping into their car, the offender uses one of a number of distraction techniques including saying they have a nail in their car tyre, that they have dropped money, or by asking for directions or change.

Whilst the victim is distracted a purse, cards from the purse are taken, or cards loose in the victim's pocket are taken. Offenders already know the PIN. These offences usually take place during the afternoon or early evening. Victims are often parked in the disabled bays and are aged over 70. Please keep a close eye on your purse, wallet or handbag. Always make sure no-one can see the numbers you enter for your PIN at cashpoints or at store checkouts. If you are approached, or see something and suspect a crime may be in progress, please alert police using **999**.
