

News from your District Councillor - John Matthissen Devolution

The change of Government seems to have caused some delay and possibly a re-think. The consultation period on devolution of powers from Westminster to a combined authority covering all of Suffolk and much of Norfolk is over and key statistics are now available. Only about half of respondents are in favour of devolution and an elected mayor for Norfolk and Suffolk. With 4 councils in Norfolk opposing the scheme as well, devolution may not go ahead; we should know more during November.

Mid Suffolk and Babergh HQ move to Ipswich

This move was duly pushed through Council by the Conservative group, by 26 votes to 12, with 2 Conservatives voting against. There was a long debate, with opposition members expressing many misgivings. It was notable that all Stowmarket members voted for the move to Ipswich. I voted against because I believe the move will provide poor access for the public, as only 2 access points, one in each district, are now envisaged, on the basis that most enquiries will be dealt with via the web site and telephone.

The fundamental principle however is that the Headquarters of the council should be in one or other of the Districts that the council serves, so that the council is visible and identifiable to the public that it serves, an important part of public trust in local government and council accountability.

I was puzzled and then amused by the consultation regarding a mobile post office visiting Great Finborough twice a week. It appears that the Postmaster from Stowupland has been providing the service unofficially for the last few months, but the management has now caught up and is making the arrangement official. Your Library Van - Use it or lose it

When Suffolk County Council cut down on mobile library vans earlier in the decade many people assumed that Great Finborough lost their van. We actually kept it - but only just.

The library van comes every fourth Friday to Oak Close - opposite the playground. It comes from 4.10pm to 4.30pm. The next two dates are 25 November and 23 December. Although the library fits into a small van, it has a surprisingly good stock, although you can reserve books online.

You don't need to have your card in your pocket to take out books from the mobile library. If you already have already got a library card, you can usually simply give your name and address. If you haven't got a card, don't worry, bring along proof of identification and they will give you a card or you can complete the online form and they will send the card to you.

If you want a reservation to come in the van you will need to change your registration to the Mobile Library at Bury, which you can do either online at the Suffolk Libraries site (using My Account and then Personal Details) or you can ask for this to be changed in the van itself.

A great advantage of the library van is that when you take out a book then you can do this for two months rather than the three weeks that you get from a static library such as Stowmarket.

However, the mobile library has to be used more or we could lose it. Suffolk have only committed to keeping the library buildings open, and not the vans. There is not - yet - any friends' organisations for the village library vans. I am trying to set up a friends of mobile libraries to stop Suffolk County Council cutting back on these, and if you want to know more about this then please email me on jaspencer00@gmail.com. From the Rectory – *looking backwards and forwards!*

On a whim, in late September, I went to London for the day. I always seem to find my way to an art gallery when I do that and this time was no exception. I went to the Courtauld Gallery and spent a wonderful hour or so looking at Renoir's and



Manet's and a few other Impressionist painters' works. Then I went to a book shop near Westminster Abbey, I had promised myself I'd look in next time I was in London. As I got off the bus I realised that the Abbey bells were ringing and people were pouring out of the building. I went up to the BBC camera people and asked them what I'd just missed. Apparently Esther Rantzen had just left but I was within a couple of feet of Chris Evans, Aled Jones and many others — most of whom I have no idea who they were! The occasion, the BBC lady told me, was Terry Wogan's memorial service.

Some say you should never look back with longing or re-visit your past. But I think remembering and delighting in what has been is quite important some times. A memorial service is an opportunity to give thanks for a life well lived and to share memories.

In early October I went, at the invitation of my previous church in Felixstowe where I had been a minister for 11 years, to preach and conduct their two Sunday services at 8am and 10am. It was definitely a trip down memory lane for me; Felixstowe was where I had lived with my late husband for a number of happy years before his untimely death and it was where I had loved being right by the sea. It was good to go back – but I am also glad to have been given the opportunity to come and live amongst you all in these rural villages. Life moves on and so must we. Change is not to be feared.

November is the time in the churches calendar when we look back and remember too. We call it the Kingdom Season. An image of the Church is of a pilgrim people because throughout the Church year we travel with Jesus in the readings, sermons and prayers we have in church

each Sunday. We witness the birth of Christ, we listen to his teaching, we are there at his execution, and we celebrate his resurrection. In November we also recollect saints and ordinary people and in our church services on Sunday 13 November we confront issues of war and peace, loss and personal sacrifice, as we remember those whose lives have been lost in the service of their country. And this year we continue to remember those whose lives were lost 100 years ago as the First World War waged on.

As we reach the end of the month though we begin to look forwards towards the celebration of the birth of Jesus. And this is where the POSADA comes in!

A set of beautifully carved wooden figures will be travelling around each parish during December. Joseph, Mary and the donkey need lodging each night during Advent as they travel to Bethlehem to look for a place for Mary to have her baby. You might be one of the lucky ones who gives them a home for the night – the next day you pass them on to the next household – and on Christmas Eve whoever has them is asked to ensure they get to your parish church for the Christmas Day service. You'll find a little book inside the bag they travel in, so you can write about your experience with the POSADA.

NHS Continuing Health Care

NHS Continuing Healthcare is NHS fully funded care that is provided for individuals who are not in hospital and have been assessed as having a "primary health need".

A couple of the many misconceptions are: -

I have to be in a nursing home/care home to receive it. No, the care maybe provided in your own home; and

It is depended on my income and size of my bank account. No, NHS Continuing Healthcare is not means tested.

Nevertheless, it is still difficult to meet the criteria for obtaining NHS Continuing Healthcare because its looks at a whole range of needs together with their severity and complexity.

When reviewing and assessing your needs, you may be reviewed using a screening tool called the Checklist to identify if you may be eligible for NHS Continuing Healthcare. However, it is not an indication as to whether or not you are actually eligible. This can be done by a nurse if you are in hospital and on a pathway to being discharged; a doctor or nurse in your own home or a social worker. There are other practitioners that may also be able to complete the Checklist. going through the Checklist it suggests you may be eligible, the local clinical commissioning group (CCG) will then write to you to confirm whether or not you will be referred for a full assessment of your needs. This assessment is carried out by a multidisciplinary team, using a tool called the Decision Support Tool. This tool is used to assess whether your main or primary care needs relate to your health by looking at several types of care needs. The multidisciplinary team will then make a recommendation to the CCG about your eligibility. The CCG will then write to you to confirm whether or not you are eligible. If you are eligible for NHS Continuing Healthcare, the next stage is to arrange a suitable care package.

Please be aware that that your eligibility for NHS Continuing Healthcare will be reviewed regularly. If your care needs change, the funding arrangements may change.
