

Project to provide a public defibrillator

A suggestion has been made that the parish council look into the provision of a public access defibrillator.

Sudden Cardiac Arrest happens between 140,000 and 200,000 times a year in the UK, making it one of our country's largest killers. The potential for saving a life is dependent on time, the faster medical help is given, the better the chance of survival. Clinical studies suggest you have 8 minutes to save a life, we are several minutes at best from the emergency services and a publicly accessible defibrillator would give vital help whilst waiting for an ambulance.

The cost of a Defibrillator and Cabinet is approximately £2000. The Defibrillators can be used by any member of the public. Once activated the unit will then talk you through the process, it can detect whether there is a heart rhythm and will not operate if one is found.

The Parish Council would need to consider;

- how to raise funds for the initial purchase of a unit and heated cabinet,
- where it would be centrally located,
- who will take ownership of the equipment once the funding has been raised

There will be some ongoing costs in association with the provision of a public defibrillator including an electricity supply to heat the cabinet and charge the batteries.

Where's the toilet?

This is the question being asked by many, since fundraising and plans to install fully accessible facilities — as well as a 'kitchenette' area — in St Andrew's Church have been in progress for some considerable time without anything concrete to show for it.

You may remember I took the bold step of making a New Year resolution for 2016 stating that the facilities would be in use by Christmas... well, plans are drawn up, permission has been granted by the Diocese, and — with your help -we have raised £25,000 - BUT, when contractors were invited to tender it became clear that we have only half the funds we need to complete the project, hence the Finance and Property committee have been considering how to move forward. So please accept my apologies for raising false hopes!

Fundraising is an obvious suggestion — and is an ongoing challenge simply to keep the church going, without any additions or improvements — but practical help can also make a huge difference. So this time we are **appealing for your help** to get the first steps of the project under way. Do you have time/ physical stamina/ equipment/ expertise you could offer, for example, to:-

- dig a trench from the church boundary wall to bring mains water to the building
- dismantle an internal wall to enable disabled access to the toilet
- take up floorboards so that level access can be created

Meanwhile, we intend to apply for further grant monies, initially from the Landfill Communities Fund. As well as regular church services, baptisms, weddings and funerals we have also organised coffee mornings, concerts, festivals and the like – but the lack of toilet facilities can put people off (indeed, there have been times when nearby neighbours have come to the aid of someone desperate to 'go'!) and, whilst we *always* offer refreshments after services and at community events, this currently entails bringing water carriers to the church and a kind volunteer taking away dirty cups/ glasses, etc to be

washed up and returned. We really do need the kind of facilities expected in any public place in the 21st century! **Please can you help** by writing a Letter of Support to accompany our grant application? There's no limit to how many we submit, but without them we have little chance of success.

If you are prepared to help or want to know more, please get in touch either by email to watts@snsr.freeserve.co.uk or drop a note through the door at Odd Corner (near the church). Letters of Support – a simple statement, not too lengthy - may be addressed 'to whom it may concern' and must be received by the end of December.

Unusually, we're not asking for money – but needless to say, we won't turn any donations away!

News from your District Councillor - John Matthissen

Council Headquarters – I have yet to see any detailed plans for the move to Endeavour House, Ipswich, but the key issue still under debate is the remaining presence of frontline staff and public access within Mid Suffolk's borders. I am arguing for many frontline services being available in Stowmarket (or Needham) and to the north of the District in Eye.

Recycling – It is disappointing to report that recycling figures are no longer improving and indeed there is some sign that a few people are putting the wrong material into green bins, leading to entire lorry loads being rejected for recycling. The textile recycling scheme has been withdrawn, don't put bags in the green bin any more, so we are encouraged to take textiles to charity shops or designated bins located at Solar, Asda, Tesco and the Household Waste site near the football ground. We are also asked to squash empty plastic bottles and screw the lid back on, as lids otherwise tend to get filtered out during the sorting process along with most material smaller than 4cm. Please do

all you can to continue recycling successfully which does not only help the environment but also saves you money through Council Tax.

Power cuts – Do you need extra support during a power cut? UK Power Networks may be able to help. Their services are free to customers who need them. Being on their Priority Services Register will ensure you receive extra support if you experience a power cut – to check if you would be eligible for this, follow the links on their website www.ukpowernetworks.co.uk, or ring them on 0800 169 9970.

Foodbank – When you are stocking up ahead of the Christmas and New Year celebrations, don't forget the individuals and families who will, in crisis, turn to the foodbank for help. Everyday items like long-life milk and toilet rolls are needed as well as tinned vegetables and meat, coffee and hot chocolate. There are donation points in most local supermarkets and all local churches.

Around the Parishes

At long last the work has been finished at **St Andrews Gt Finborough** at a cost approaching £130K. Thank you to all who have made this possible and for several kind parishioners who have granted the church personal loans to enable this work to be completed. Others will report on the Kitchen and toilet plans that are being discussed, though there will be no work undertaken until we have been able to pay off our indebtedness.

I was pleased to be part of Finborough Schools **Remembrance service** on the 11 November and of the parade to the mound for the Act of Remembrance. Also, an amazing display of 140 **pottery poppies** was made by the Primary School and shown for the Remembrance service which was attended by the school for the first time. Mr Stephen Dodd, the headteacher, read one of the lessons.

All are welcome to join the **Primary school** at Key Stage I's Nativity in St Mary's Buxhall on Tuesday 20 December at 10am and the rest of the school at their Carol Service at St Andrew's at 2.15 the same day.

Onehouse Church Council continues to pursue the revamping of Trinity Hall and **Buxhall** continues to explore with Historic England,

the Diocese and other interested parties the installation of external doors to the porch in an effort to conserve heating and make the church more useable.

Many people find it **difficult** to attend church on Sundays and so can I remind you once again of the weekday services especially the Holy Communion at Onehouse on Wednesdays at 9.30 which can be followed by coffee in Trinity Hall with the Good Neighbours group.

At **Combs** we are pleased that the roof is now being replaced and the bell fund continues to grow gently together with the congregation. **Little Finborough** seem to have managed to replace a rotten wooden beam without bringing the West gable and bellcote down.

We are also pleased to welcome **Jeremy Lind** to our parishes as an Ordinand (trainee priest) at the request of the Bishop. Jeremy will be working with us until July to broaden his experience of ministry in the Church. He is already being made welcome.

The death of **Mr John Kendall** cannot just be left without comment. The highest attendance ever was recorded at St Marys Buxhall of 397 for his Memorial service. He is missed very much by the parishes of the Gt Finborough Group, especially Gt Finborough itself because of his very significant amount of work there over the past few years, great personal generosity and obvious ability. That was only part of his lifelong faith and service to God and community. What we have lost is insignificant to that felt by Liz and the family as well as his home church of Shelland. From the Rectory December 2016

The people of America have confounded the political classes in electing Donald Trump, just as did the people of the United Kingdom in voting for Brexit. Conventional wisdom says 'Ignore the people at your peril because ultimately they will prevail'



For a political system to be effective it needs to enable all to feel they have a voice. During most of the worlds history and for many today, large numbers are not heard. It maybe that in America, as here, Donald Trump has triumphed as people voted for him against the political classes rather than *for* his policies – a sort of Proxy election as the Bishop of Willsden said of Brexit. In democracies there are those who pretend to represent a groups but quietly label their 'supporters' bigots, racists or keep their own counsel covering all with fine words and trying to work towards an unattainable utopia. But their actions speak louder than their words. They forget the power and perhaps, more importantly, the secrecy of the ballot box.

This is not in any way to pander to racism bigotry or the downright 'I'm alright jack culture' that is abroad in many places — it is simply to acknowledge something of what has happened in two of the worlds most developed democracies.

Winston Churchill apparently said that democracy was the least bad of all systems of government and it is certainly better than that which existed in Palestine at the time of Jesus. Herod ruled with duplicity and terror on behalf of the Romans. Herod tried to remove the Christ child as a threat. He didn't prevail because of the skill and diplomacy of others. Ultimately of course no one prevails over the Christ child because Jesus was born offering a great and fundamental truth for us all that we need to live in peace and harmony, looking after each other being kind and generous in our views and dealings. Force, clever words and pandering to base instincts might win power temporarily but it is fleeting. 'Sic transit Gloria mundi'

Replies to Councillor Otton regarding Great Finborough Bus Service

I can confirm that much work has been done by my network bus colleagues on this issue, also correspondence has been sent to Mrs xxxx of Great Finborough to explain the situation. It is evident that over the past 3 weeks the 461 has operated to full capacity on Thursdays, and we understand that 4 residents of Great Finborough are seeking our solution to this matter. Unfortunately funding an additional route for a small number of residents would create additional costs to the contract of approximately 29%. More importantly we also fund the Mid Suffolk Connecting Communities service for which bookings to Stowmarket can be made up to two weeks in advance with flexible timings, the return fare for this is £4.00. If customers find access to Connecting Communities financially difficult without use of concessionary passes the operator BSEVC can consider supporting costs through a bursary. Further information on this can be provided by the service Manager David Finn manager@bsevc.co.uk / Tel: 07840 412354

Sue Davey, Connecting Communities Transport Manager

We do have capacity for runs to and from Great Finborough, the connecting communities service operates a number of journeys to and from this area at present, for Great Finborough residents.

We also have a community car service, which residents may find cheaper if they are willing to share a journey with others. This is where volunteer drivers use their own vehicles to move people from a to b. Charges are 45p per mile + VAT (54p) plus a £1 booking fee plus VAT (£1.20) for each single journey. Great Finborough to Stowmarket and Return would be around £8, which between 4 people is £2 each.

Please do pass on our details to passengers, booking office is 01449 614271, and ask them to call us to discuss their needs and the options available. We also have a larger vehicle that could be available if there were a larger number of people that wanted a regular day/time, we could offer this at around £3 per return journey for up to 15 passengers. I would be more than happy to meet potential passengers to discuss options, we are very keen to enable as many people as possible to travel

A heart attack is when your heart is starved of oxygen, causing damage to your heart muscle. Please call 999 without delay if you believe you or someone else is experiencing a heart attack.

Signs and symptoms vary from one person to another, below are the most common signs and symptoms:

- Chest Pain your chest may feel tight or heavy. You may experience pain or a burning feeling in your chest. Not everyone experiences chest pain.
- You may have pain which radiates down your arms, neck, jaw, stomach or back.
- You may only experience pain in one of these places. This pain or tightness may be severe, or may just feel a bit uncomfortable.
- Shortness of breath and sweating often to touch the person feels cold and clammy.
- Feeling light headed, you may experience nausea or vomiting
- Some people may have a feeling of indigestion or reflux.
- Generally feeling unwell or lethargic can be an indication of a heart attack when accompanied by chest pain or discomfort.

Having a heart attack is a frightening experience, however after a heart attack many people make a full recovery within a few months, but some people find they can't do as much as they could previously. This is due to damage to your heart muscle, so act quickly and call 999, as the sooner you receive treatment you will prevent further damage to your heart muscle.
