

Great Finborough Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Village Meeting was held on 11 May this year. We heard from various groups and organisations in the village about their achievements in the past 12 months, giving us a chance to acknowledge the huge amount of time and effort their members give to the community. This meeting is also a chance for all residents to get together to discuss issues affecting the village. It is not a council meeting; it is a village meeting. I hope that next year many more of you will come and contribute. Issues raised this year included:

Parking in Church Road: Some inconsiderate parking is causing problems. It is narrow and, if you have to park there, please consider whether residents, emergency vehicles and other essential vehicles, will be able to manoeuvre around your car.

Winter Maintenance: Some people are concerned that they could be subject to litigation if they spread the salt grit from parish council provided grit heaps and boxes. This is not true. Anybody who is able and willing to spread the salt during the Winter months to help others when the paths are slippery should let the parish clerk know in advance. Whether you are able to help regularly or just on one occasion, if you have once registered with me as a volunteer, you are insured to use the salt for the public good. Street lighting: The Parish Council is considering a major project to replace or choose not to replace the street lights for which it is responsible on the High Road. News from your District Councillor

I am pleased to report that on 7 May I was re-elected to Mid Suffolk District Council (MSDC) to represent the five villages of Onehouse, Great Finborough, Buxhall, Harleston and Shelland. Many thanks to everyone who voted for me.

There is a danger that many of the decisions that affect the district, and potentially all who live here, are made by officers using powers delegated by members of the Ruling Conservative group — the party with the largest number of members. It is a key role of local members to query the reasons for these decisions and, where appropriate, to challenge them. My re-election and other successes have resulted in the Green Party being the second largest group at MSDC and we are the main opposition to the Conservative group which has, in my view (a view shared by many others) given a high priority to cutting spending on services and a low priority to ensuring that services provided to residents are satisfactory, sufficient and accessible.

See it, Hear it, Report it

Detectives are appealing to local communities to help them put an end to a series of 80 burglaries across Suffolk and south Norfolk by launching the 'See it, Hear it, Report it' campaign. 68 of these were in Suffolk; mostly in Mid Suffolk and Babergh. A retired couple from a village near Bury St Edmunds, was victims of a burglary in early 2015, and they have spoken about the effect it had on them.

Operation Domain was launched by Suffolk Constabulary in response to the break-ins, which are being linked due to the similarities in their nature and forensic evidence from the crime scenes. they occur in rural areas, usually in the afternoon or early evening, and they involve forced entry to the property. Jewellery is the main target. Although officers are following a number of leads in pursuit of the burglars, police are appealing for local communities to be on the look-out for any suspicious behaviour in their villages, and not to disregard persons or vehicles that appear unusual or out of place.

As the majority of the burglaries in this series involve houses being entered by force rather than because they are insecure, detectives are asking people to be their 'eyes and ears' and help catch those responsible for these crimes. The 'See it, Hear it, Report it' campaign runs alongside the well-known burglary prevention message 'Close it, Lock it, Check it', but it places an extra emphasis on the importance of community intelligence in providing crucial leads to apprehend the offenders. Horse Watch Volunteers

Suffolk Constabulary is launching a Police Service Volunteer Horsewatch Scheme. We are looking for volunteers who own horses to wear Police Support Volunteer tabards whilst out and about. The volunteers will not be required to undertake anything more than being a visible deterrent on horseback, and reporting crimes or anti-social behaviour if they either witness them or have them reported to them directly. Suffolk Horse Watch Police Support Volunteer can offer help and support in a number of ways including:

- Assisting Suffolk Police in reducing crime by promoting security and increasing crime prevention awareness in rural communities;
- Assisting Suffolk Police in detecting crime by promoting effective communication and the prompt reporting of suspicious and criminal activity in rural areas;
- Identifying hot-spot areas for signal crimes, anti-social behaviour and animal related offences and report these to police.

Suffolk's Community Health Services

The preferred bidder has been announced to deliver NHS community health services for the population of Suffolk. West Suffolk NHS Foundation Trust, Ipswich Hospital NHS Trust and Norfolk Community Health and Care NHS Trust have collaborated and have won the contract, which will be held by West Suffolk Hospital.

Patients will continue to receive the same safe, high quality services, by the same staff in the same locations. The commissioners do not anticipate any job losses. Services are to remain as they are currently commissioned apart from minor changes to accommodate additional need. The same experienced and dedicated staff will continue to deliver the same services in the same locations. It is recognised that Suffolk Community Healthcare staff are dedicated and hardworking individuals who play an important role in the health and wellbeing of local people.

Community health services are currently delivered by Serco, whose contract will end on 30 September 2015. Serco chose not to bid for the contract. The providers will deliver a range of adult community services, specialist children's services and community hospitals. It will work across the whole of the county, with the exception of the Waveney area, serving in excess of 600,000 people. Over the coming


